Hi Juan, after some 4 abortive attempts, due mainly to poor diving conditions, things finally slotted together on a trip in June that myself and Julie made to cantabria. After a few set up and familiarisation dives, I reached my old limit at -72 m in the shaft. Continuing downwards, a definite floor was reached at -81 m on a slope of silty boulders. Following this led downwards into a gallery of modest proportions with a snaggy boulder floor. Only a short amount, about 20m of line was laid to -83 m, due to the difficulty of manoeuvring with the side mounted 20 litre cylinders in the poor vis.

The cave is definitely continuing downwards though. I have passed this info on to Josep Guarro of the SIE for their cave diving website. I have invited any Spanish divers to continue pushing this sump, but I would be most surprised if they get anywhere as it is a truly daunting prospect. It is unlikely I will return as having invested £5k in a rebreather system I would like to find a site where it fits !

I have also made a couple of dives in Comedianta this year. This is a very complex and large sump, the vis is usually not good enough to search passage of this size. However, I'm gradually building up a feel for the place and I'm nothing if not persistent. We will probably have a couple of dives here this august, conditions permitting, and see what we find. Hope the info is of interest, have a good summer, Rupert.



25th July.


Juan, Penny + Jen walked to end of Frente las Vayas track to investigate lack of holes on map. No holes found.

1920: Removed cores. Juan down 4m narrow shaft that chokes


1923 ^{NEW}: At base of 4m high limestone face. A 4m wide cave entrance that enters a 7m long crawl that chokes all round.

1918: At end of cave is a narrow slit with a good draught. Poked video spy camera down to reveal a slot to the

left through which the draught might be coming.
A possible "high tech" dig.

306: Then got to Torca de la Clara del Cuzco which Pete and Nigel explored on 19/8/81. Phil went down on one ladder to check out. The shaft was 25m deep.

1924 ^{NEW}: Then down hill to the east (20m) where Phil slide down a vegetated hole



1925 ^{NEW}: 3m drop down soil slope to a small closed chamber

1917: Removed 2 planks. Then down 4m shaft to a slot through into "chamber" that sloped down to a choke.


Total depth ~ 9m.

1926 ^{NEW}: A small pneumatic tube that has a 5m drop in a narrow rift just inside the entrance. It may enlarge

1927 ^{NEW}: Just below track past TV mast depression. One hole is boulder-covered. Others need investigation.

30/7/03 Serruco - Dave B, Dave T, Nick

We arrived yesterday, we leave tomorrow!
So we went to Serruco to look at the bottom lead. This turned out to be a 35° slope of loose rock leading down. After a bit it was choked, but a little digging opened this out and a continuing passage with an overhand draught was created. However shortly after the rift closes briefly and the squeeze is just that but too awkward (and sharp) to attempt today. Passage beyond beckens - echo is good and there is a "black space" about 5m or in the rift.

Squeeze needs either the right hand wall Hilti - capped away, or all the sharp bits flattened with a hammer, or a smaller cover (say, a bit like Pete Egn). Not difficult.

Ropes left in place.

Note - the last bolt on the "entrance" pitch series needs a second nut added to it because the knot rubs!

The route through the cave is effectively "roped" - the start of the second roped section is on the opposite side of the main chamber about 5m above where you come in.

Watch out for the slime - it will get you!

31/7 Some info about Drills

B315

The new Hitachi drill is about 30% quicker than the Bosch with the metal bracket on it. The old Bosch still works, but seems to have lots of wear on the gearbox, so is about 30% less good again.

The Hitachi charger will charge the batteries in about 1 hour.

The large box with the knobs and meters is a charger - here are the instructions:

- x) Make sure that all 4 knobs are turned fully to the left (anticlockwise).
- x) Turn it on (small blue switch)
- x) Turn the leftmost knob (Voltage - Course) fully right (clockwise)
- x) The CV light should go out and the CC light should come on. The voltage indicator should go to 70V
- x) Attach the battery
- x) The voltage indicator should fall to the voltage of the battery (about 26V)
- x) Adjust the current knob (right hand set) to the desired charge current
- x) Wait

The small Bosch battery is 1.2 Ah the large one is 4.5 Ah

So, using this charger you can charge the big

battery in about 1 1/4 hours - or trickle charge it slowly overnight.


You can do a lot of damage with this charger - be careful

If you use a high current rate you must make sure you pay attention the how long it is on for and how hot it gets!

Then to find 1914 at the base of a cliff - GPS gave position with no visible limestone. Cliff was 20m downhill with a cold drought coming out of rift. Needs hilti cap to remove large flake.

Up to site 1922 on side of large shalehole. Phil dug to enter top of descending rift that is currently too tight. Hilti cap job again. Good drought.





Points split, Pacey + Tonya went to drop shaft in top passage
rel to "glory" at bottom. Easy trip to bottom of
steep rift on right of main chamber (looking down slope)
this rift ends in a blank wall, pass way on may be
under boulder floor, but no sign of it. To right is a
high rift with a route through at floor level - this is
the squeeze that needed work. We used two hillti
bongs a lot of hammer work to get through. As soon
as you drop through you see a high narrow rift with
much caliche, at floor level round the first corner
is mud & this lower section backs up in wet wetter
mud due to a caliche dam in front - NO Gp at
floor level + no draught. Spent 2 hrs climbing up
rift to see if any levels would go - none did

the rift is some 10m high & narrow at about 0.5m, but heavy calcite makes progress very difficult. Best way seemed to be near top, but a calcite flow blocked way on. A few feet more progress may be possible for a very thin person, but as you can see the rift is narrow for much more than this, any progress would need a lot of Hilti work over many days! No chance of progress ~~any~~ at all.


This would seem to be the end of it, except you can hear water(?) flowing/falling at bottom - long way off but it is clear, - not easy to hear where it comes from.

Surveyed out - also surveyed Pacy's top passage this did not fit in with old survey - reason my compass was 120° out - very odd as it was OK two days before - must be due to the heat!!!

3/8/03 Side 1847. Pete had previously opened up this muddy-floored area to reveal a bouldery rift down to a crawl. Juan + Pete descended to crawl and dug it out to enter a low passage to a boulder choke blocking the way on. This was dug out for 3m to allow Pete to squeeze through to where the flat out crawl turned into a two-narrow rift.




Decended previously rigged pitches to approximately half way down, decended pitch close to normal route down to a small hole seen two days previous. Some chiselling allowed access to 8m pitch going nowhere at the bottom. Derigged this and continued normal route to bottom to attempt siphoning wet crawl. Siphon tube worked but head was too small to produce good flow. Frantic bailing did little to lower level. One or ~~two~~ two other digs investigated, some drafts but not carry way on. Derigged leaving siphon tube in place. Should anyone need 20 foot of hose pipe, it will still be there.





Moved on to number ③ which is more promising. Removed a lot of boulders and got into clean washed area with anastomosis roof. Potential of slope cleaned up to remove more boulders. Also dug at area ④ creating new crate in chamber where part-time stream descends. Loose roof. Potential for site: - reasonable - need rope and bucket plus spade. Also worth looking up sandy crawl ② with a spade and tray.



Drought - into hill is away from you, showing it must go to bottom of hill - would cap, but at least a 1m would need to be taken off to a corner - may need a lot more!

Description: -

Hole is collapse into on all passage at top of cone at head of Codocera valley & slope down to TV mast on Basaltic - cone must be cut-off in both directions due to hill slope.

Slick down entrance slope to flat floor with chaled cone to SW & slope to pitch to NE - our pitch is continuation of cone - not gone into, but must be cut-off by hill v. soon. Traverse to south (right) ~~to~~ down boulder slope ^{to 6m} to two bolts (nuts in place) for 1.2m pitch to Big boulder & ledge - rope is hung on right - to avoid any rock falls. Next pitch is free 25m shaft behind flake that gives protection from rock from above. At bottom no go, but climb up (or swing in) to left - to south, at back narrow section on hand to left - gives access to 20m of climbing rift passage to 7" to 8" slot - with drought away from you (summer) - would cap, but be a long job.

went to look at the OVLOV Sump in case it had drained and was no longer a Sump. Water level had gone down and there was no flow from Sump so would be a good place to dam and bail; estimated time for bailing this with bucket leaving a 'dry' Sump. First Sump would take about 1/2 hour to bail but then this just leads to a rift into a sandstone and the other Sump would have to be bailed. It's approx 4-5ft deep in current conditions



9/Aug/03 - Hole in the Road - MS, AP, DS

Went to explore in new passage at bottom of boulder collapse. Squeeze down under boulders to left of last survey point (P) leads to 45° rift and with hole down (unexplored). Over top leads to boulders leading eventually to crawl under solid wall with gravel bottom. Passage then opens out and enters a reasonably big stream passage down a ramp. This is followed keeping to the left hand side into large passage. On right areas can be seen up mud slopes. Continuing cave ends at ~~big~~ large boulder collapse. Directly ^{above} last survey station is an area with water dripping down. Boulder collapse can be climbed up about 15m with small hole in ceiling with small draft between boulders. At stream level a squeeze gains a small chamber with stool (2nd level) giving view down to streamway.

11th Aug. Tony + Roy (DCC), Andy P + Juan up in Roy's Court Estate towards site 1935 below the TV Mast track. Car gave up just above the vine yard and Roy had to back down to park.

3 continued to 1935. Ladder pitch & belayed to entrance tree. Juan down to find just enough to coax Tony down. Tony dug at bottom into squeeze through and choke. Daylight seen coming in probably from draughting hole 10m in limestone face.




The site 1937 @ 5225(5)9511(0). A vegetated depression has sandstone block and a limestone face. 3m deep. No draught


Walk on Enasa to search for site F from 15th/24th April still did not find it. Noted hole above 1595 needing digging.

August 11th Bibbay + Ted + Alan

① Removed rocks and got into cave. Draughts in along almost horizontal crawl with slope.



561 (top)

② Site F turned out to be a larger than usual surface collapse in an area full of them. Notable because of obvious rocks covering up holes.

✓ ③ Cave 1881 entered. 2m drop to tight rift with flat floor ends in blank wall after 4m.

Went well using snappers, but we did not take rope & bucket - so digging was slowed up. Very good inward draft - pulling grass into entrance!



A very steady traverse of the river passage leading to the terminal sump was made due to a rapidly overheating/overloaded diver. New line tied on at 90m and a steep descent made to large blocks and belay, the way on was finally followed behind the blocks down to -22m until the passage started to rise gradually to -17m, the way on continues the same. 1/3rd were needed after laying 110m of line in a westward direction making a dive length of 200m to the current limit.

On the way out a stark look at the choke between Sumps 2 + 3 (1+2 pp). revealed an easy walk through blocks to a large chamber with no way on. ~~John~~ After 3hrs a return to base was made. John added brewing up to the long list of debt re-payments. Efficiently fed and watered we crammed all the gear into 5 loads and made it all the way back to the top of double ditch Pitch. A line reel for line repairs was left in the choke leading to Valline 2 for future use.
