Steve Foster: (On Telephone) Hello!

Juan: Hello Steve, your mum was very drunk
last night.

Scene 4: Plymouth B.F. Terminal.

B.F. Employee: Get your boarding cards for the
aeroplane here. You will fly tomorrow.

Tonight you may sleep on the Armadillo
which has struggled here on one engine.
We will give you a free breakfast.

Spanish lady: This is not good enough. Aeroplanes
crash. I wish to see the owner.

B.F. Employee: Don't be silly madam. Aeroplanes don't crash.

OFFSTAGE.

Guardia: Do not take photographs of Bilbao airport sir.

Scene 10: Somewhere in Spain 9.00 p.m.

All: When will we get to Santander?

Scene 11: Santander 9.30 p.m.

Scene 12. Motiengo . 12.00 p.m.

Radio: Here is the news. A plane chartered by Brittany ferries crashed near Exeter tonight. No-one was hurt but the wing fell off.

21st July


Today the leader led from behind as is recommended by all the best mountaineers.

Juan + Penny went to the beach + Noja and lay in the sun, then on to Isla to eat octopus, back to Sotorzano + picked up Pedro at the carboy bar. Very enjoyable. Saw a buzzard.

Went up Muella; saw a buzzard. Walked up looking for the various depressions visible on the maps; started from the waterfall and went straight up the 45° scrub slope toward the top.

The lower parts of the slopes are quite boggy but half way to the first line of bluffs the ground changes to be dry & firm - located a spring on the boundary (probably a line of springs to make that area so wet) with some old stalk on the surface. (Please don't throw my sample away Juan).

Saw large bird on the bluff (honest). Dropped pencil. First depression (base on map 634.00) is large shake hole with three sides of fluted clints and a grassy base - labeled PD1. Bottom of shake hole choked but boulder conceals beneath its smooth white shiny surface a pit!



Sides are vertical but the bottom is choked with soil.



Anyway! Rocks capped down joint on the eastern side go down about 10 feet? - easy to get into.


Moved off toward 70S.00 ($\approx 110^\circ$). Saw a big bird. Saw a beautiful butterfly. Found pencil.

70S is a large grassy depression with three sides closed by 20 foot cliffs and a grassy run in from the SEE. Large amounts of water must collect here, the base has a hole choked with mud two feet deep (at least) and animal tracks lead down to bottom. Whole hole (see I know the difference) is probably 30m across. and 6m deep. Marked as PD2.


Set off for 71S & found - two large holes in the cliffs - capped rocks down (10-20 feet) but probably nothing. Got lost & went too far so headed back to PD1. Found another hole (PD3) about 50 feet from PD1




Found 71S. Extensive but really only a loop in the karst (20-30m long)



Moving over to 727.00 came ~ 80 feet to three large holes in a large depression (probably supposed to be 715.00)



- (c) is $\approx 10'$ long, 5' wide with soil base $\approx 10'$ deep. NE corner not examined but SW probably runs back to (b)
 (b) Lost pencil. About 40-50 feet deep with soil floor sloping toward (c). Generally very large hole.




(a) full of low grass, $\approx 5m$ deep 20m long - base could run into (c).

Returning to base camp! Bluff below PD1 has several open holes at its base. Examined one and marked it PD5. Goes in about 10' and then a 15' pitch up appears - another route up in entrance. Generally a goat & cow shelter. Directly beneath a large triangular growth of vines. Bluff - has several small truncated phreatic tubes at various heights.



Please take great care not to walk on sandy Swedish lady diddling herself at the base of the climb.




23rd July

Penny + Juan to beach + Laredo. Coming back found large river sink below a shit heap + lots of little holes. Patrick up Muella - says he won't write about it. Pete wants to pretend today didn't exist. (Most ungracious after we fed him on tuna steaks)

Wait I write about my wonderful trip up Muella. I get up at 8:30 to go so as not to get sunburn - rolled sleeves down instead. Slept for one hour at the top, can't remember anything else. Peter's shaft ~~fall~~ lets rock down for about 6 seconds & Penny says I can count seconds accurately 1001 1002 1003 1004, crash 1005 1006 crash. Quite deep this one. Boring.

26th July

Penny, Pat, Pete, Juan along ^{new} track flanking Muella on
the Lluera side. Climbed up with 8 ladders + 200' rope to do
Torre de la Espina (128):




Put 175' of ladder on to make sure it reached the bottom. It did, comfortably, as it turned out to be 96' deep. Dropped into a quite large chamber with calcite flows and mud slopes ~~going~~ down to the inevitable choke. On returning to the bottom of the pitch:-
Pete : It chokes, but you could come down to take some photos - you could get some good ones of the pitch.

Juan : But I haven't got my flash.

Pete : Well you might get one just with the daylight coming down the shaft. And then we could survey it as well.


Juan : But I haven't got the tape.

Anyway, thanks to Pat for the lifelining, and to Penny for the sandwiches.



Juan Ben descended 168 - 45ft deep to horse skeleton, frog and salamander - blocked.

Mated SC 1



2 shafts Ben done in Matienzo soon W of Volvo 143 and 144. Both in brush - 143 in fresh depression, 20ft tight take off to slope down to choke-about 30ft long. Nice formations.

144 - 5ft drop on sloping soil ledge, Ben 30ft ladder to 25'x10' chamber climb up at both end to nothing - sloping bedding under W wall right "go". Chamber end under the road - freshly broken stal. on floor.


25th July.

At great personal sacrifice Penny + Pat (but mostly Pat) emptied the nasty bog bucket. What a lovely birthday present for a lucky boy.


Grey clouds, drizzle, rain.

171 Series of 3, 15 - 20m pitches to choked rift




26th July. Rain

Went to fiesta at Riva — boring! Band had stopped playing but kids were blowing themselves up with bangers.

27 July Sun.

Juan, Penny, Pedro & Pat into Bigga. Juan & Penny for photos & Pedro & Pat to continue bolting. Put in two more bolts and get up to where Barry got last year — his big blank wall on a big blank slab, glued to the wall by mud. Bits falling off all around.

Juan built swedish man for swedish woman. Penny wants to know how ~~is~~ it's compares with Salford Phils. Actual quote 'I bet even Salford Phils isn't that big.'

Anyway, thanks to Pete for lifelining.

A vote of thanks to Uncle's Juan, Pat + Peter for letting me go into Bigga, + be frightened stiff. Thanks also for the hot kias karanga some idiot left in the car.

Steve fell and party left.

28th July - Sunny + hot very.


Juan Peony, Patrick Peter to San Miguel.

J + P to large depression on 1X-32 G spotting no holes at all at all. Came down after 2 hours to twin ravines next to road (labelled 176) Northwesterly one day slight draught ^{4m of orange} good to. Southerly one good flow but required a JB up river. Water emerges from crack but on left is a strongly draughting hole that could be dry. Hole also on right could not be reached.

When we left the car we immediately re-found "Peter Plummet", another possibly new cave, Nacimientos, and another glass-filled low entrance. But after that we toiled up the hill, and only found the Torre de las Auras. But on the way up we'd heard the tragic bit - the Laredo cavers had already done it - it was 81 point something metres deep. Still we toiled up the hill, to look into the big depression on the pass over to Ogario. It's a hard life!

Anyway, thanks to Pat for the pineapple lime and Shine.

29th July.



John D and Linda arrived - early (well 10:00 a.m.) John had a busy day - wine in the Snaws, welded the baker's bread trays, more wine in Snaws, wine in German's. Fell over.


30th July. Hot - but up on Muella it was quite chilly.

Patrick went for a nice walkies again today.

Found various holes; went to my 13S which I had marked & Foster had not found; remarked it PD12.

Field around (NE of) depression 705.00 full of holes (found a hole in clints 60-70' deep - PD¹⁸⁰ a small dead bush in entrance 50' from PD a)¹⁶⁵

Shoulder between muella & Mullir has two pairs of shafts on grassy slope (Muella side) 181 & 182



Lack of ammo again but PD13 probably 70 feet deep; PD14 at least 40 feet deep.

Area around 136 is full of holes ; marked PD15 &
PD16 rumble rumble rumble ; 50 - 100 feet deep.

Lots of other ~~holes~~ ^{↑ spelling}. Another small 1 foot diameter

hole up slope on southern side botfly 30' deep.

Came back via slope SE of 181, 182 ; lots of
lucky fresh collapses and one 30 foot shaft (PD17)
in area 183.

CUEVA DEL VOLVO : Juan and Pete returned to this classic
trip. On the right from the chamber they eventually found a crawl
which was draughting - possibly it's the one on the survey - but a
boulder was blocking the way. It needs a big lump hammer - or 7,000
kilos of Goma-2. Then on the left they found - at least Juan
did because he was wearing the wet-suit - that the sump was a
Spanish sump (i.e. 5 feet air-space) and he followed it to a
duct with much lower air-space. But it's still going. All it needs
is a young lady with blonde hair and big tits who'll go in and
take off all her clothes.

These tremendous events (they would have been monumental if Perchos
Grandes had been there) were followed by the epic first descent of
the Rio Asón, from Riva to Ogario. All white water and red wine -
and a packet of bum - pulling the boats over the boulders and shooting
the cascades, blowing up the boats as we went and bailing them with
a shoe. Linked inseparably with a painter, nothing stopped the heroes,
not even a slightly-angry river warden. Penny and Linda were waiting

(Really it was a case of wading down the Asón with brief spells of floating of very deep crystal clear water.) The journey took 6 hours during which time were sighted a kite (Penny's version) or a buzzard (Pete), a water snake, an irate trout fisherman & various people who called "Are you English?" - How did they guess? During the lunch stop at Valle Pat stepped out into the only sewer outlet spotted on the way.

140 - soft shaft with single tree in small hole - choked.


141 - small hole in grass 48 ft pitch to 2 chambers - ice with floor and stal.





The exploits of the British caving expedition based in Matienzo have once more come to the attention of the press. A group of four drove to Alysa to investigate four shafts - holes in the ground reputed to go for miles. Mr Peter Smith - who is in fact a layabout of no fixed abode and not an English teacher from Santander as was reported in this paper on the second August -

descended a shaft and spent an hour investigating parallel shafts underground. On his return to the surface he became securely attached to the ladder with a crab - known in caving circles as a crab. According to his companions he then started giggling uncontrollably and had to sent back down the

shaft to free a ladder stuck 75ft down the hole. He finally emerged after 90 minutes, and was told off by his companions.

Descended entrance shaft on very slippery rope, sensible people used ladders, landed on ~~the~~ pile of supporting mesh, down into nice big passage (see last year's bullet) took lots of photos, tried to push through digging into "small" chamber with calcified choke! no go! Photo'd out until Pedro + Julie made everyone go up large side passage with big rocks "ending" in steep calcite slope. Pedro cut "steps" up for 16m leading to "small" chamber with nice pretties, unfortunately this led immediately to a shaft, estimated to be less than 50' (16m) and not very promising. On way back Tony looked into a window in the wall, this lead to another shaft which is at least 30m (standard rock-dropping measurement) all could be the best bet. The 50' shaft seen in the main chamber last year was descended by Pedro and found to be choked at -47'. Squinnel + Gordon SRT'd out and organised a good line for the rest of the sweet party to surface ~~via~~ via the ladder. A nice big core with excellent floor formations which won't last long, and some pushing/surveying etc to be finished.

FRI. 8th Uzuka Tony Fifield, Andy S.

Went in at about 12-25 am for an overnight trip to push 3rd River inlet, tape the route through Armageddon and survey some bypass. On arriving at 3rd R. dumped Bunting and shot off up to the over and deep pool (previous end) at about 200m in. The deep pool turned out to be only about 10m long, with about 8' of water and 10" airspace, in fairly dry condition after this the passage reverted to a ~4m x 75cm damp bedding which continued in a fairly straight line for ~300m

at the end of which a of passage had developed. At the end of this the river vanished under the walls in a sump, but on the right wall (going in), there was a 5' climb up into a short section of zig-zag type passage, which led into an approximately parallel passage which was dry (1m x ~3m high.) This had occasional pools in the floor as if the river was following underneath us. Up to this point there was a fair amount of rubbish in the river. eg tins, poly bags, bits of washing up bowl (etc), bits of cloth, bones etc. At the end of this section was a dry, sandy chamber. To the left there was a passage of about 15 m which continued to a stal blockage (breakable). To the left there was a hole leading down to a parallel passage which was small and very muddy. Both of these branches took about equal shares of the ^{draught} (wind). This muddy passage meandered on for ~200 m until its ceiling too aven, the end of which we climbed to ~50 ft until blocked by boulders. There was still a weak draught going between the boulders at this point. Boulders were sand/gritstone type, but there was no debris. Surveyed out, reaching the oven at about 1-15 pm, sat around for a bit, eating morsels, getting temp etc and set off out, leaving the burning for arrangement at the end of the inlet for the next party. - Reached the surface at about 3-40 pm for a 15^{1/2} hr trip. This extension, totalling ~800 m (See Survey) is totally gratty and unpleasing, but has about 3 places where further pushing (tight and very) could be done.






Climbed up to point reached last year and saw that Patrick had bypassed the boulder I didn't like the look of. Steve Foster then bolted up to a large ledge about 15' higher and rigged a ladder. The rest of the team then climbed up and assembled on the ledge. Easy free climbing then took us up another 30' to another huge ledge with a yawning over going on up. All large ledges about 20' apart and could easily be done with the pole. Paul and Steve then climbed up about a further 30-40' and Steve said he thought he could see a roof higher still. The top point visible is probably 250' above stream level and the possibilities of a sumptuous bypass here, now seem very remote. There was a good draught blowing down the face which could be felt at the bottom but the top was draughtless. However at the top of the climb there is a parallel over where the draught probably comes from. This, however, would be very difficult to reach.

Bolton Dig. (Fri 8th August) Joe, Ron, Big Bill and Andy Taylor went up to look at a draughting hole above the Hen Run Bar, found in '78. Found the hole again - on a hillside covered in short gorse, next to a fence. A very inviting cold draught was still blowing strongly out of the hole, as it was when originally found. Investigation revealed a leading rift with a fill of sand, ~~and~~ pebbles and boulders. Some digging was done but it became obvious that a bucket and rope were required. These were got (a milk churn anyway) and also Fred, who volunteered to dig under a very loose pile of boulders. A lot of loose stuff was removed, not without incident - Fred being pinned by a boulder which had to be removed by Ron. Eventually Fred was able to descend to a phreatic area at the base of the slope, and climb up into a small chamber, which was blind. Realising he had lost the draught, he used a lighter to establish that the draught was coming from a small partially choked passage off. This he started digging, but the unstable nature of the fill above brought a halt to the day's activities. We all decided to return with some stomples and make the place a bit safer before any further digging.

Frank (me) went into right hand section of maze with similar results, all the low level stuff is well filled with sand or pebbles with little or no drought. On returning towards the ramp, a drought (not necessarily the drought) was found coming out of a calcified chalcocite, strong ~~enough~~ enough to blow sweat forms downwards. A bit of boulder bashing led into a small chamber with a further squeeze into another smaller chamber. The drought was relocated in the first of the chambers and upwards digging was started again (without hammer etc) until the limit of patience was reached. It'll be worth finishing the dig because

Say 18 m., ~~through~~ critical foliage, landing on dead cow. Down through calcified rift to vertical drop of 5 m, landing on dead cow. Continuation of rift tight and traverse to drop which might require a sample. Drafts out! Inconclusive, horrid, and a future trip should be done on ladder.

Second drop in zone one also belay to bush, 30 m. free hang in large shaft. Landing on boulders near dead cow. Checks in both directions, ~~no~~ no draft. Other shafts exist in this area and after a brief walk about coupled with a wave of lethargy we fell off the rope.

Fuente de la Ceniza.

We went up to Riaño after Steve F. + co., who were going to Torcon, with the intention of looking for shafts nearby which may have gone into the end of our previous extension of 3rd River inlet. However, it was much too hot to walk up the hill so we went down the track by the bus garage, and in the bottom of the depression, headed round to the right along the base of the scar (same as Menaka). After ~50 yards found draughting hole with goat shit in it. Continued round to the end of the scar and joined a track heading right. After ~100m found stream crossing out of cave entrance (Matiendo '75, No 4 on Riaño plan) About 20m round corner met a cold patch, and thus found a hole with an icy gale coming out of it. Dick scuba gear (from Riaño, ^{supplied by Diver} divers) and then Andy went down. Followed passage for ~150m via crawl and rift to large chamber with ways on. Got lost coming out. Total length looked at ~300m?. Go back tomorrow

After a fairly easy carry in Phil and Fred kitted up and arrived at the sump where Phil impressed everyone present by stripping down to the 2nd stage of his valve immediately prior to diving.

Phil set off first to locate the air bell he had found on a previous visit. Having done this he returned for Fred, and both divers passed the sump without incident. At the far end of the air bell a passage was noticed leading off in the general direction of wazuka. (It was initially planned to use the air bell for a base for further exploration) Phil de-kitted and climbed a six metre cherty rift to confirm that the passage went.

Continued after J.C.'s hole 19/8/80.

Julie Cellarion

Paul e Grobet.

50 ft and 100 ft shafts at end of cellarion were descended.

Bott are crooked & with calcite in ~~bott~~ boulders. No draft felt in either. Skeletons of two animals (about size of a rabbit) were found at bottom of 50 ft shaft. One was in a natural pose on a shelf under a overhang suggesting it was live when in the cave. Surface connection? 100 ft shaft had several large ledges with one possible parallel shaft, not worth battering with as ended at same depth.

On way out found a side passage with two further 50 ft shafts in them. First 50 ft shaft ~~still~~ looks same as predicted and 2 descended same day the 4th is more promising. The problem is where to belay as floor, (which all seem hollow in this area) is flaking calcite. Left ^{entrance} ladders in so these shaft can be looked at at a latter date.

Cave needs lots of pushing parties + surveyors.

Biggs upstream dive 14A Boy. Jill. Roz. Tony. Took sledge hammer and pickaxe ~~the~~ in to destroy cascades and remove sump. However, the rock at the cascades seems to be the only decent piece in the place and is totally indestructible. Back at the previous trips diving base a draughting rift was spotted and an attempt made to climb up. However, it was very sharp and greasy and needs 1 or 2 bottles for protection, which would then make it easy. as well as the draught there were flies buzzing about which promises!? a surface connection.

Divers:-

Squirrel, Fred, Phil & Ron (cpt). Fred & Ron with carbide lamps! and without wetsuit hoods! Heavy white line was fixed thru' sump of shallow depth, and 50' (16m) in length with v. poor vis. Landing is not an air bed as first thought - it is a large chamber with a flat bedding roof. A 6m calcite climb at end of chamber leads to passage thru' bedding to larger chamber. The perimeter of the chamber consists of large blocks. A choked area beyond this chamber was investigated & the limit of exploration was a ~~150mm~~ slot down to possible river passage (water seen flowing). Draught was slight as compared with the strong draught at the terminal choke of UZEKA! On the return a "strongly" draughting passage was found but was not believed to be significant. The far choke is complex enough to require a "ball & string" technique for thorough investigation. Return & journey uneventful - bottles left in.






14th Fresnedo again ~~Frank + Tom~~

Set of to descend the two soft climbs found on previous trip. First shaft is a circular tube which calcates up at floor level. Second pitch is a climb down on a rift. From here a 6' drop rocked a choked boulder floor in an oval shaft not much bigger than body size. Digging is possible here but would be very awkward. The draught still continues to howl up out of the floor even though the day was colder & rainy to most. Today 19/8/60

Tried other den kitted and joined Phil. A phreatic tube lead off through a pool of water to a flat out crawl and finally to another climb. This gave access to a large chamber with a big boulder floor. The way on was down through another slot in the same wall that gave access to the chamber. Here an area of boulder ~~car~~ chaos was entered. Squeezing through boulders, around boulders, up boulders and down boulders eventually led to both divers beginning to feel heat exhaustion coming on. This wasn't surprising as both had been exploring in full diving wet suits and ^{were} having to passy foot about in wet socks.

The return was not easily found, as one boulder climb looks very much as the other. It had just got to the stage where we were wondering who would come and rescue us when the way back was found. Diving line was used to help on the climb down to the air bell. and an uneventful return dive was made.

If the limit of exploration was in boulders with water being heard in the distance. It seemed to both divers this must be the way to Uzneka, and.



A fairly easy carry was made to the sump, where Squint decided that things had got to much the night before and wasn't going to dive.




