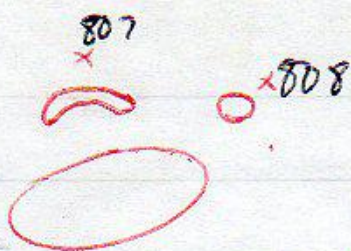

Another crawl under boulders led "uphill" about 10/15 ft then down to look into clean rift about 10' deep (too narrow to enter).

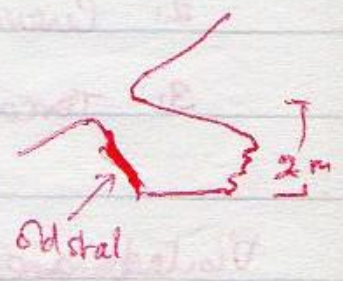
Plan of (1)

 it was a cold day. **SHAFT TAGGED**

Walked around and passed Sima Werdy (79)  
 looking in all shakeholes found small  
 cave <sup>BD1</sup> (10' long) as shown with small

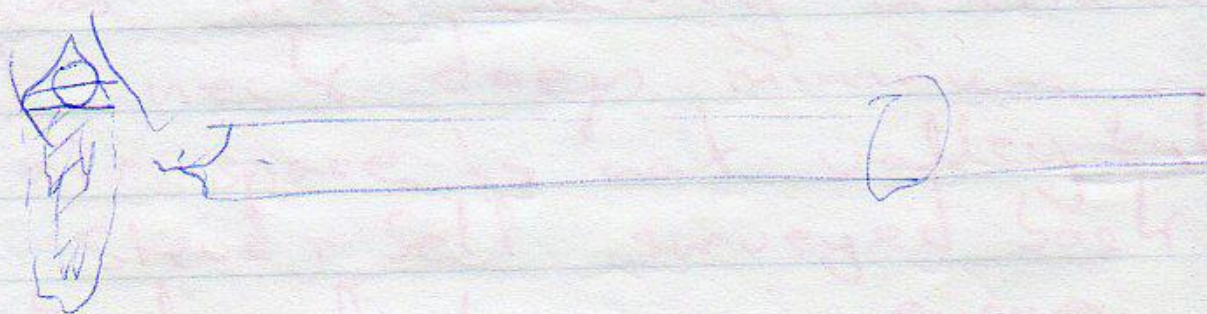

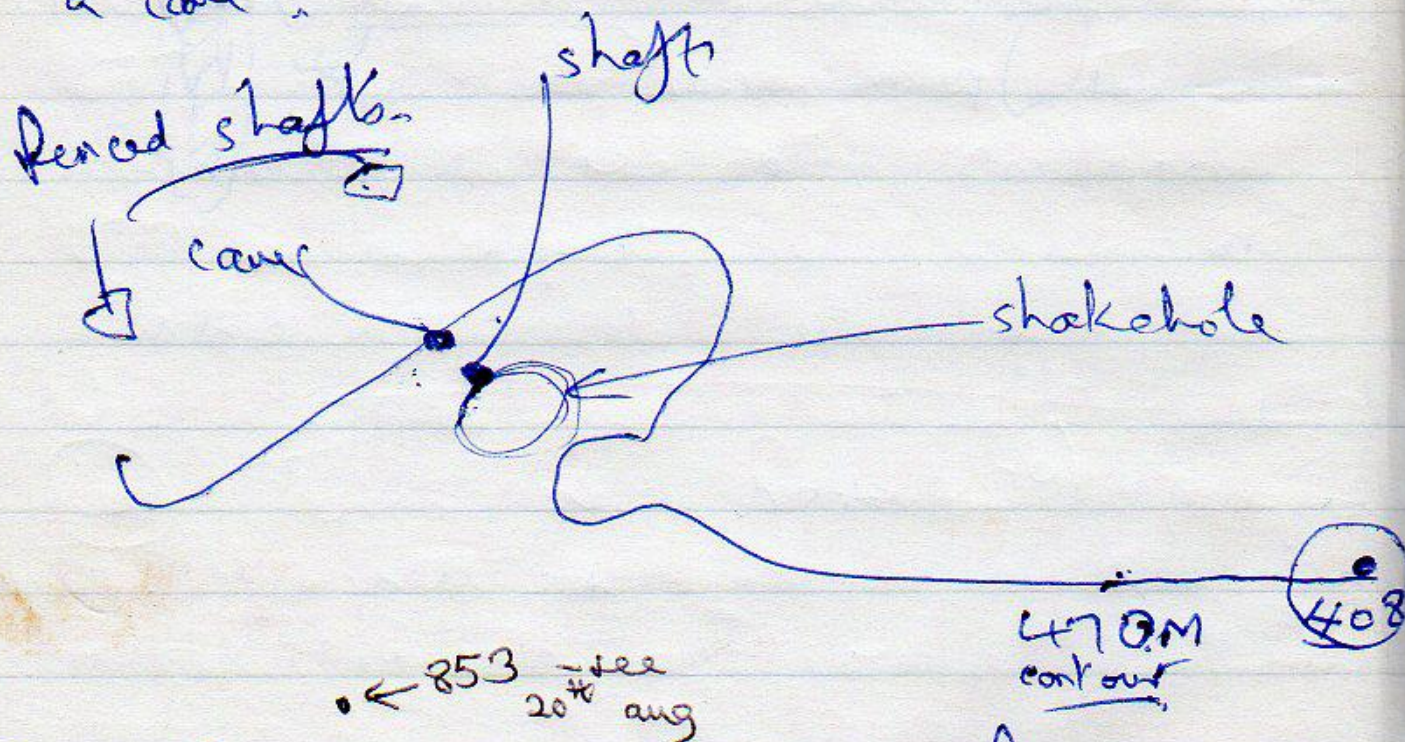

Following the joint successful surveying trip (which hasn't been written up yet (surprise, surprise)) we decided to push the yellow Herba area in the high level right at the end of the cave. Previously we had stopped here simply because it seemed like a convenient place to do so. So after taking some photos in the entrance series and the far right we arrived. A climb up over the boulders ~~back~~ and then down again led us to a fairly low but wide passage on the right and a short continuation of the boulders straight on. The former passage after about 15m opened out into a high rift about 3m wide ending in a pool of water thought to be the other side of the pool found at the end of lower level streamway.

The latter passage, after a squeeze thru a yellow boulder turned out to reconnect to the pool passage via an ox low. This passage is in fact directly below the high level right passage which explains why we saw water below us - a short climb up proved this.

These passages did not contain the draught previously noted in the cave so we started to look around the

boulders where we had climbed up. A route through the boulders was easily found although some ~~stages~~ squares between delicately balanced blocks produced some squeaks of delight.

Immediately after the 'choke' was left we <sup>met a steamway and</sup> noted a general increase in passage size (over 5m where we left the choke).

It was decided to push upstream first in good sized steam passage with occasional stoops and crawls through 1" deep pools. Pebbles in this area are black and form small tanks in some places. Upstream was pushed to an obvious junction - both ways are still wide open in 1.5-2.0 m high passage, although the right hand fork probably joins and overflows. Surveying commenced with much enthusiasm back to the end of the choke.

After a quick jettie (of the cartridges) we ran off downstream into a steam canyon, which started almost at the junction. This passage is all very similar and was surveyed at ~900m with no end in sight. One or two distinctive features were seen in the steam way. One was a 70m long calcite flow on the left (looking downstream) with a possible passage above. After about 700m a large

oxlow is encountered, at a slightly higher level (1m+) running for about 60m before returning to the stream. Another possible oxlow was seen almost at the end of the surveyed cave but was not explored. One or two boulder collapses are encountered in the canyon but are all easily passed at stream level. Again we stopped to survey but because we found a distinctive small oxlow in the stream but beyond this is still under open. Other passages may be found ~~on~~ above the canyon on shelves but we did not explore the higher levels. Surveying had taken a considerable time but we considered ~~the~~ ~~it~~ ~~was~~ ~~for~~ ~~the~~ ~~glory~~ ~~it~~ ~~was~~ ~~worth~~ ~~it~~. At the boulder chute we moved through it and linked back up to the last survey station from the previous trip. Exited cave with no further grids at approx 8:30, did a surface bearing on the entrance and returned to Matenco.

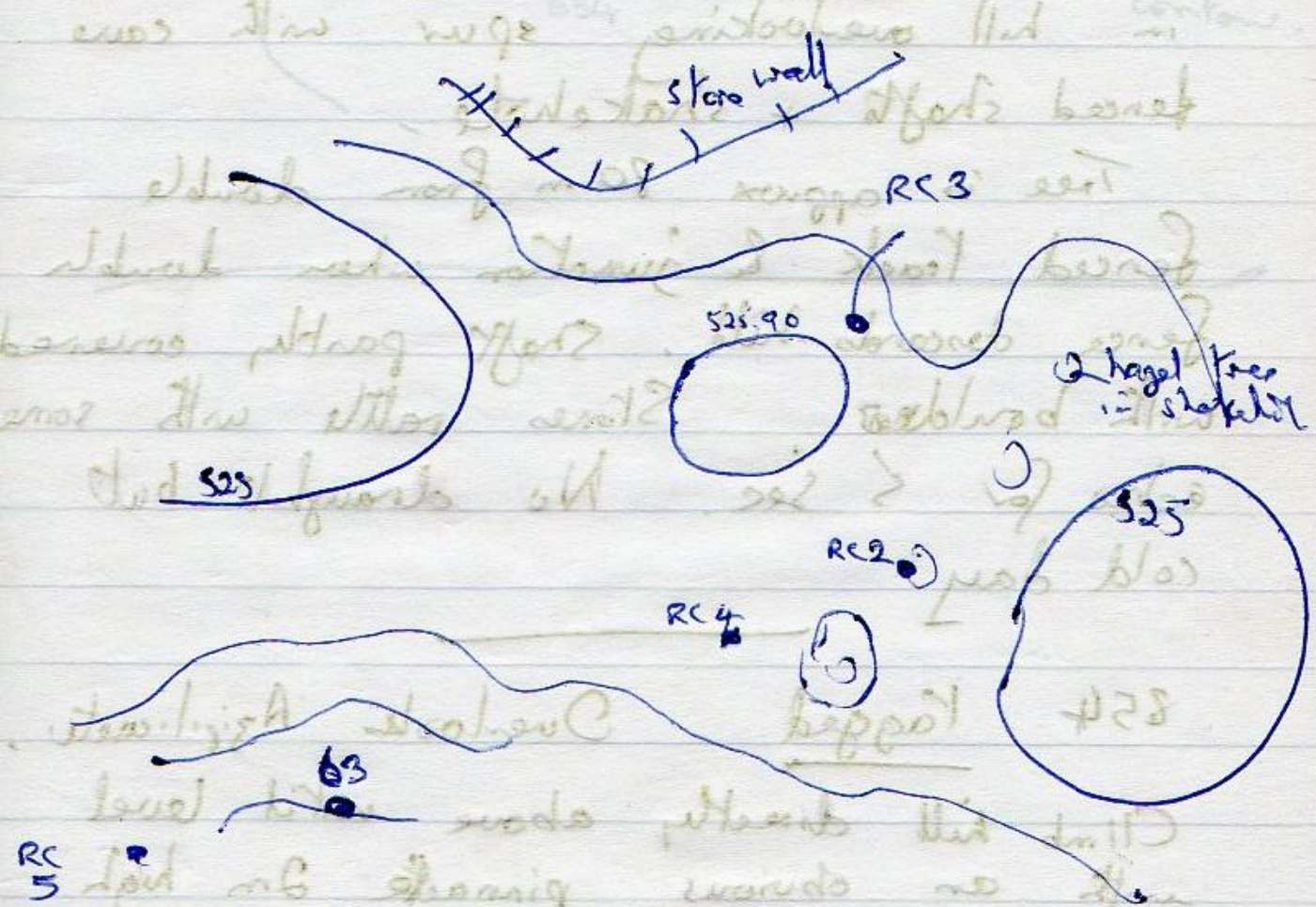

cold day

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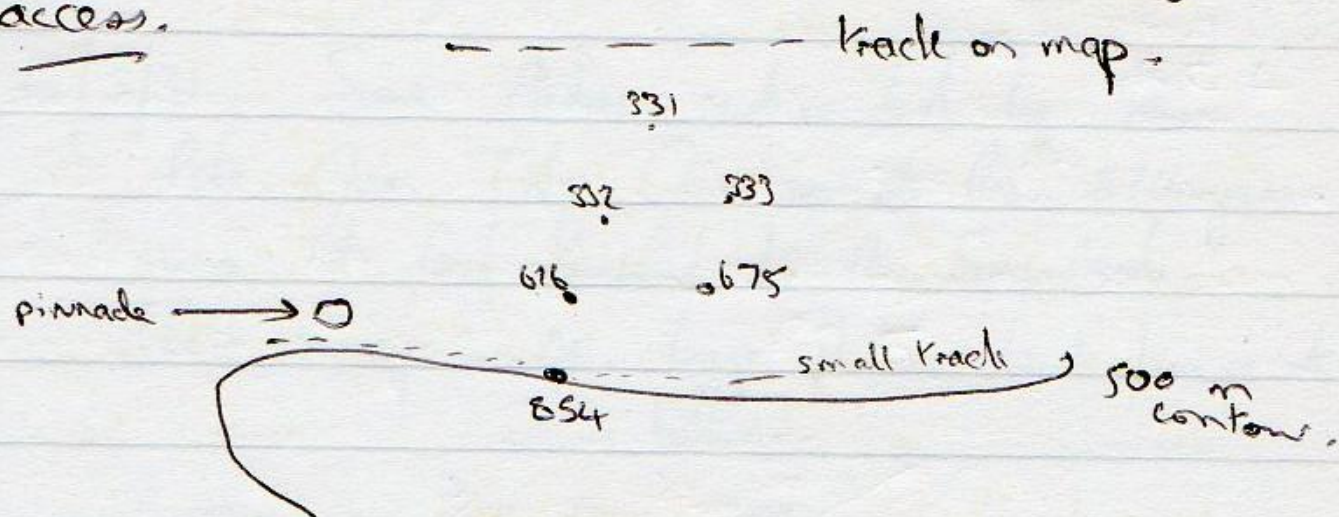
854 Tagged Overlooks Azpillicote
