Shaft bashing Bosmentis  
Steve O, Peter Eagan, Dave Salvia,

Parked car at quarry on road to  
fuentelas Uvas. Walked up to 100 yds  
slab of Ben up hill, first shaft  
soft closed. Many more smaller  
shafts all closed.

Crossed col near pillars and  
peered into enormous hole (supper)  
200 yds beyond found shaft large  
top with booming sound at bottom  
walked back for side of Bosmentis  
and saw many shafts closed probably  
frozen.

22nd July 1993

Popped back to Tres Niños for certain glory especially for Pedro.  
Aim to drop pitch ground (at bottom of west rift pitch) at Easter.  
Pitch ground to 20 ft depth with 40 yds of lightning passage at foot.  
Very depressing, Pedro's hopes of glory dashed for the time being.  
Rerigged by rift pitch and looked at climb to possible passage  
above inclined ~~right~~ rift. Pete completed hairy climb and  
delayed rope for others to follow. Possible way on over rift climb  
but too wide for comfort. Main way on through tubular passage  
with gypsum sand and helictes on floor and walls. to head of  
30 ft pitch. Lands on ~~pitch~~ sand slope which is blind at  
foot. Left cave with ~~pitch~~ dispersed spirals and rerigged  
main pitches. Trip 7 1/2 hrs. Goulash for dinner. Lonely.  
Followed by mixed junk salad with strawberry yogurt on top.

REPLACED ROPES ON TRAVERSE NEAR RESTRANGE PITCH. USED BLUEWATER TO RIG ONE TIGHT & ONE LOOSE LINE. REPLACED NO IRONMONKEY BUT ADDED 2 MAILLONS. REMOVED OLD ROPE. BROKE BIT MORE OF LADDER JUST ON FROM TRAVERSING BY LIGHT BOUNCING ON RUNG. BOOTS ON ENTRANCE REDWAYS NOT GOOD. (APPARENTLY USED WRONG ROPE...)

RETURN TO PASSAGE LOOKED AT BY MYSELF A FEW EDGES AT EASTERN ENT. BEDDING OLDER THAN I REMEMBERED ALTHO' I COULDN'T FIND IT ON THE WAY INTO THE CAVE. PUSHED BEYOND THE CAT ROOSTING PLACE & ONTO A BREAKDOWN CHAMBER WITH A SMALL GRILL BLOCKING PROGRESS INTO PASSAGE BEYOND - AFTER REMOVING APPROPRIATE STAL. ACCESS WAS GAINED INTO CONTINENTAL ENDING IN A SMALL CHAMBER. WEN DECORATED. A SMALL TUBE OUT OF CHAMBER LEADS TO MORE STAL & AFTER GOING PAST AN AVEN (CLIMBED FOR ~10M, STILL GOING UP) A BLIND PIT IN THE FLOOR CAN BE TRANSFERRED TO A SMALL AFT THAT CHECKS WITH STAL. THERE LOOKS AS IF THERE MIGHT BE A V. SMALL PASSAGE AT THE BOTTOM BUT WOULD BE V. DIFF. TO GET INTO IT. NO DRAUGHT IS PRESENT.

MISSED THE PRETTY BITS THE OTHER'S FOUND (BUT DIDN'T HAVE ALL THAT CRAWLING!) & PLANGED AROUND IN ALL THE BITS OF PASSAGE THAT LOOKED INTERESTINGLY MOST WORKS WERE PUSHED. JOAN DIDN'T SEEM TO BE WEARING HIS CAMP ANYWAY. BIG PASSAGE LEADING TO MOSJACO DROPPED DOWN THING! BOULDER CHOKER AT END. A FEW SURVEY MARKS FOUND BUT NO RECORD OF DESCENT OF "10' HOLE?" AT END. 3' ROUND HOLE OVER 20' PITCH BOOMS, ECHOS & SAYS 'DROP HERE FOR MOSJACO EXPRESS' SO HAVING NO GEAR WE WET IT - FOR TOMORROW.

Dinner

Rigged the ladder pitches, and big pitch without any major problems, and went to have a look round. Then, quickly to Sky Passage to something Steve had poked his head into last year. A short crawl, and the passage suddenly enlarged - GLORY. We followed a stream passage upstream, past several side passages and largish avents. After a wet crawl we finally came to the (sump, I thought), but Steve and Pete E had other ideas. By digging away holes the water level was lowered and we continued through the duck. More stream passage and we came to the base of a pitch, about 20 foot, with a rift passage visible at the top. Exactly opposite this a sandy ramp soared into darkness (disappearing inexorably) - GLORY again. This reached another climb up, which Pete E and Steve went up to further passage and a maze. Surveyed out, about 600 m without incidents. Surfaced at midnight.

24/7/93 GRAFT BASING - ENVASO

TONY BLACKBURN, MARK RIDER, DAVE WATTS

Headed towards Summit from here at back of Pablos.

Found tight, <sup>(midget reqd!)</sup> S64 (932) on walk up, stone tested to 25'.

Found 149/150 and descended 20' shaft ~~to~~ 50m E, (933) way on is first sized, around a fluke and doesn't appear to open up. 12m N. is drop into small chamber, way on is tiny hole over sand, needs digging. (934). No draught.

Higher up - between 64 and 184 is undescended shaft, 30 feet plus, echoing and large ~~(935)~~ Probably 64, but not in the right spot.

24/7/93

REGATON

Aim is to push upstream leads in Streamway off Shy Passage. Most leads go into tight rift but one lead off to continuing tight passage after 200m.


At sandy ramp, near inclined pitch, a new route was followed at E a lower level to a well decorated grotto with nice stal (there still there!!) to a low draughting arch. This was dug out to gain an area of low immature streamway after approx 70-80m.

On this trip the duct was deemed too deep for entered casing and so was lowered to enable dry passage.

While Steve & Phil took some stal samples Pete & Paul went to boulder choke area at downstream extremity. Here they descended to rift in the floor to gain a pitch as yet undescended. Draught very strong. Exited cave too late again and got to bar at 12 pm. to join Pedro single handedly keeping the bar open by consuming 1 Tinto every hour.

25/7/93. Sunday.



Pete S, Phil P and Dave underground. Blind leading to blind. Set off at 1pm. Got lost. Arrived at canal dig. East dig thru house sized passage. Ideally need lump hammer, crow bar & resources of channel tunnel company. Set fire to neoprene at 3pm in presence.

Everyone else on surface:

Tran and Paul into Dormouse Cave. Boulder choke with streamway which Paul went along to dig in floor. Smoke, which was expected at 2pm, did not emerge at 3-30pm from Dormouse Cave and a boulder choke to the east. Descriptions could seem to tally - Dormouse Cave needs pushing and surveying. Retired to Riñón bar, overindulging the barmaid with blancos and beer orders.

DORMOUSE CAVE: THRU BUT A DOWN THRU CHOKE WITH DAYLIGHT ENTERING FROM ABOVE. FOUND STREAM IN FLOOR UNTIL A SQUEEZE UP & OVER A BOUNDER CHOKER REENTERS STALL STREAM. THIS MAY BE FOLLOWED U. LOW & LET THRU BEING PENETRATED BY STALL CHAMBERS FOR ~40m. WAY ON NEEDS OILING BUT LOOKS OK PAUL.

3. Passage at 1st junction after Lavado Junction - Worthwhile passage with mud and a bit of calcite at end.


27/7/93 : CUBIO DE CUBITA - P. STREET, P. EAGAN, S. OPPENSHAW (here)

ENT. NEEDED DIGGING BUT SLIGHTLY HELPED BY HURRICAN DRAUGHT BLASTING LEAVES OUT. STEEPLY INCLINED RIFT (~4m) LED TO RIFT WITH LARGE AMOUNTS OF FLOOD DEBRIS EVERYWHERE. NARROW RIFT CONTINUED FOR ~15m TO JUNCTION. CONTINUING STRAIGHT AHEAD A LOW CRAWL GOES UP THRU' SMALL GAP UNDER OVERHANGING ROCKS. LOW STREAM PASSAGE CONTINUES TO BEDDING, FILLED WITH CORALS & OCCASIONAL AVENS/CHAMBERS A NARROW PITCH (~4m). SEVERAL SMALL PASSAGES LEAD OFF FROM CHAMBER BUT NONE DRAUGHT SIGNIFICANTLY. BEST GET IS NARROW CANYON THAT GETS TOO TIGHT A SHORT WAY N. LEFT OF JUNCTION.

A short section of passage just in cave. Bottom of climb left, a draughtily squawling size passage leads to the head of a pitel. The pitel drops over large blocks which don't quite touch the floor. Below two large blocks form a small entrance to a crawl

rooded with blocks (unstable wood, corkly out) routes through honey combed type sandy limestone with sharp corners and sharp bends enter a larger section with small esch with ~~leads~~ which leads to a short section of washed limestone tube with clear pools in the floor. This leads eventually to the head of a 15ft climb / Pitel down into small chamber unentered.





27th July 1993. Toby, Jane, Pedro. FRESNADO II  
 Back to climb above Cascade Inlet and up into Knotted Rope Series. Climb rigged as single pitch of about 20m. Pedro & Jane surveyed 60m of passage heading towards Known Passage. Toby dropped pitch left from last year. About 90' in big shaft to boat sized outlet & no draught. A passage was noticed 30' above point of entry into the shaft and another one was seen across the shaft about 20' down from point of entry. Walls of shaft are calcite & slime so it will be hard to enter either of these passages but the strong draught entering at the pitch head must go somewhere. Pedro climbed into Knotted Rope Chamber - nice stats but no way on. Traverse over <sup>upwards</sup> pitch will be done next.

26/7/93 Legation - Larrie Trip? ↓

Steve O, Phil P, P. Eagan.  
 Drives.

Headed upstream to look up unascended pitch into (hopefully) continuation of steamway. Took approx 1 1/2 hrs & 3 bolts on auto-climber to gain the top. At the top steamway continues for approx 50 m in reasonably wide, sharp meandering rift where upon the stream passage pops out into a large 15m chamber. Numerous holes in sides of chamber looked at but main way on continues up a couple of chimneys (~10 ft) and into another large chamber. On the right on a sandy patch at stream level was a perfectly preserved skeleton of a dog/cat/animal of some description. This has obviously fallen ~~up~~ from directly above or from upstream, as there are no broken bones visible ~30m upstream a choke is met and although the normally strong draught is still present it is very much reduced; presumably disappearing in the choke and holes in the roof of the larger chambers.



New passage named "Laines hart stand" surveyed back to the base of the 25ft pitch and exited same in good time for a change. Surface very close - surface digging commenced 27/7/93

28/7/93 Emboscados - poked at end choke. Ali Suman Rob Tree Vince Dave Si FIND REZE ALREADY

28/7/93 Cellevoy - somewhere in a bramble field Steve, Phil, Tony & Mark. Bloody hell, see Phil/Steve for details. TOOK THE 3 OF US TO

THE WEST TOP OF THE RAMP BEHIND CLIMB. THE TOP SEEMS TO BE A PASSAGE (PASSAGE?) IN ITS OWN RIGHT RUNNING PARALLEL TO THE RAMP. AFTER SHOWING US THE FURTHEST LIMIT OF EXPLORATION STEVE LEFT TO JOIN "LASSIES...". "UP" PASSAGE BEYOND SW. ENDS AT ORAZH THE CHOKE BACK DOWN THE CHOKE HOWEVER A STEP INTO A PNEUMATIC PASSAGE LEADS TO A COMPLEX OF TUBES SOME ENDING IN A JUMP (NOT CLIMBABLE) ABOVE THE TOP END OF THE RAMP. THE MAIN WAY ON ENDS AT A LOW SIDE PASSAGE THAT ENTERS FURTHER BACK ALONG THE RAMP TOP NR. THE CLIMB INTO THE PASSAGE. AFTER CHECKING BACK DOWN THE PASSAGE NOTHING WAS FOUND OF SIGNIFICANCE UNTIL A PASSAGE, OPPOSITE THE ONE EXITED. A PNEUMATIC RIFT HEADS OFF THE RAMP AWAY (N SOUTH) GRADUALLY ASCENDING PAST SEVERAL SIDE PASSAGES (NOT ALL LOOKED AT, SOME JUST OXBOWS) UNTIL A SHORT CLIMB IS REACHED. CAVE CHANGES CHARACTER ABOVE CLIMB TO SANDY/SILTSTONE TUBE THAT EVENTUAL HITS A RIFT PASSAGE WITH STAL. THIS WAS FOLLOWED TO A NARROW ASCENDING RIFT (WITH SLIGHT DRAUGHT). PHIL RUSHED RIFT UNTIL IT SEEMED TO BE CHANGING CHARACTER AGAIN, STILL GOING ON & UP & ENLARGING. CUEVA JEL PION?

Two aims for this trip both at the downstream extremities of "The Woodhouse Way". ① To push the tight present day stream passage descending from the floor of the passage near the Boulder choke "Pilloch Passage". This is described below by Pete E.

A narrow washed black limestone passage with tight section, and one ladder piled followed by short sections of tight passage, eventually a small concretion leads to a larger area covered with mud. No way out could be found.

A very narrow rift leads off near the end of the passage, which is also clean washed limestone. The passage carries a similar draught to downstream Boulder choke area, but is only a fraction of the size.

After surveying this section of the cave Paul and self set off to Boulder choke, to find Steve and Phil had only to remove a few boulders to get through.

② Push through BOS (Bag Of Shit) Choke and downstream end of Woodhouse way. An obvious route through the choke on the left leads to a 2m climb up through some barely ~~pushed~~ perched boulders followed by a climb down to the right through equally bad boulders. Following this is a large-ish passage chamber which can be followed to the left to a large hole opening. Walking up slope we enter a 30m long 15m wide, 20m high chamber. From the roof are some nice stal



 The most obvious route upwards is opposite the point of entry to the chamber  
 in a high, sharp, heavily eroded rocky thing. This continues for 250 m  
 up a dim climb under low arches etc still ~~leading~~ <sup>leading into</sup> main  
 draught. A chamber at the apparent end is reached by a climb up  
 a sandy, rubble slope to the left. The chamber is 15x15m with  
 blocks & boulders abundant. Nice mud chimneys also only noticed after  
 treading on one or two! Holes in floor may be the way on but digg to  
 tell 'cos draught reduced considerably.





PAUL + JUSTIN TO PUSH CLIMB THAT PETE HAD LOOKED DOWN 27/7/93. <sup>WHILE</sup> ~~GRAB~~ OTHERS SURVIVED IN. CLIMB OF 3m LEAD TO A SMALL CHAMBER WITH TWO WAYS OUT. THE ACTIVE JAB IS LOW WET & TIGHT AT FAR END BUT ENDS AT A PITCH <sup>AREA AN AVEN</sup>. Dave, Andy P, Simeon = TEAM 2


THE B TEAM

Aims:-

To tackle up nearseries, to bolt up to possible passage leading out of big chamber (the blackness), to look at the passages below ~~the~~ (underneath) the climb up to the second ladder pitch, to familiarise some more people with the entrance series.

As many people know, the trip down Fresnedo to the end is now a long undertaking & is not made any easier by an awkward middle series of passages connecting the large chamber (the blackness) with Venus' playroom - the start of the 'big stuff'. We had noticed what appeared to be a passage about 60' up the wall of the big chamber on the opposite side to the passage entering it last year & hoped that bolting up to this would afford a better, less tortuous route to the end.

The party divided into 2 groups, one bolting up the chamber & the other looking at a short high series of passage that had been entered by Richard Blake the year before. This was entered & found to be very short & choked with an upwards connection into the passage near the second pitch. On return the bolting party could be seen strategically deployed on various ledges up the wall of the big chamber. The non-bolting party took up a ring-side position high on a balcony in the big chamber opposite the bolters to watch a combined re-enactment of the balcony scene from 'Romeo & Juliet' & Chipperfield's circus. Richard Barthrop did a spectacular & necky climb (using proper climb gear please note! but a nice unstretchy SRT rope) up to the balcony.

He was seconded in fine style by Toby, adding a spectacular plummeting pendulum for our entertainment when a vital handhold broke off (just the thing on SRT ropes & a waist belt!) This was followed by shouts & cries which Shakespeare might have conveyed in the immortal lines 'Alcove, alcove, wherefore art thou an alcove?' but our heroes converted into much more pithy Anglo-Saxon. Hopes of an easy route were dashed as the alcove proved to be draughtless with no hidden passages into glory.

Drove up the "back Road to Santander" — a track which goes off the Mostajo track shortly after the hand-applied concrete section, climbs over the shoulder into the Lastrilla valley and climbs up that to join the Alisas Road at Las Calzadillas. The idea was to spot the smoke released from the Regaton party (see next write-up) No smoke was spotted but amongst other things a stream sink was discovered quite high up in the valley just below the track where another track goes off. Este apartado se complementa con el estudio hidrogeológico de las aguas, que realizará la geóloga Marta Solar, perteneciente a la Universidad de Cantabria. El objetivo de este trabajo es dar a conocer por donde y cómo discurren las aguas subterráneas bajo el subsuelo, así como cuantificar el agua que encierran los acuíferos en las cuevas. Lo que si parece claro es que en el Valle del Peñajorao existe un caudal interno de grandes proporciones, que nace en el Pozón de La Dolores y desemboca en el río Pas.

### Interés arqueológico

El último de los estudios que pretenden llevarse a efecto en el valle del Peñajorao hace referencia al interés arqueológico de la cuenca kárstica.

El objetivo de este apartado completará la extensa labor realizada con la Carta Arqueológica del municipio, realizada por Emilio Muñoz y Balén Malpelo, pertenecientes ambos al CAEAP. No obstante, los estudios arqueológicos se limitarán a una revisión de la extensa documentación bibliográfica, archivos y materiales depositados en el Museo Regional de Prehistoria, que existen sobre este valle.

Entre las cuevas más importantes con yacimientos paleolíticos y arte rupestre, se podrían citar El Pendo, Santian, Cobalejos y Matto, en las que se han hallado numerosos materiales prehistóricos e, incluso, en uno de los casos (Pendo) la cueva esta sellada con una verja metálica desde hace años, por su gran interés arqueológico.

Los espeleólogos ingleses han servido de gran ayuda en los inicios de la exploración, dados sus conocimientos técnicos y el material del que disponen. No obstante, el proyecto de estudio del valle del Peñajorao está dirigido por el GEIS, que cuenta también con bastante experiencia en este tipo de operaciones. Hay que señalar además que, entre las dificultades que han encontrado para explorar la cueva, se citan los acuíferos que discurren en el interior de la caverna y que obligan a la expedición a tomar todo tipo de medidas para no quedar atrapados en el interior de la gruta. No en vano, en una primera exploración resultó herido leve el director de la misma, Carlos González Luque, que se fracturó una muñeca.

Luque contará en este estudio con la colaboración de los profesores Enrique Salgado Costas (Universidad de León); Beruete Azpilikueta (Universidad de Navarra); los doctores Demange y Mauries (Museo Nacional de Ciencias naturales de París) y, por último, colaborará en este proyecto el profesor Ribera Almerje, titular de la Universidad de Barcelona.

Como ya informó este periódico, Luque ha descubierto durante el último año un total de seis especies cavernícolas, dos de las cuales son relictas y endémicas de Camargo. Este es el caso del insecto denominado «Speocharis Sharpi intermedius», especie troglobia -sólo habita en las cavernas- de apenas un milímetro de longitud, que fue hallado en la cueva del Ruso. También es endémico y relicto a este municipio el insecto bautizado con el nombre de «Trechus Camargo», perteneciente a la especie del «carabidae Trechinae», animalillo que fue hallado en Los Covachos del Peñajorao. Estos dos insectos, según se ha demostrado en posteriores análisis científicos, son únicos en el mundo, lo cual concede, si cabe, mayor importancia al estudio que ahora realiza Luque y aconseja, aún más, la protección del entorno subterráneo del valle. No se descarta tampoco que, dada la magnitud del estudio que piensa realizarse en el Peñajorao y, en la medida que se descubran nuevas especies, se sumen a este estudio otros especialistas europeos que, hasta el momento, no han confirmado su colaboración en el mismo.

# Único parque natural kárstico de toda España

## Las conclusiones de estas investigaciones pretenden publicarse dentro de dos o tres años, edición que contará seguramente con la subvención del Ayuntamiento

El Valle del Peñañorao podría convertirse en un futuro en el único parque histórico natural de origen kárstico que exista en España, según anunció ayer el Grupo de Espeleología e Investigaciones Subterráneas (GEIS). En caso de recibir esta calificación, el entorno del Peñañorao sería protegido y se potenciaría su conservación a los niveles legales permitidos actualmente.

Como adelantó este periódico en su edición del pasado domingo, un equipo de técnicos de la Universidad de Cantabria y la Manchester University Speological Society (M.U.S.S.), dirigidos por el GEIS, realizan estos días un proyecto de estudio del medio Subterráneo en este valle. En este proyecto, se contempla el estudio de este entorno natural desde diferentes perspectivas, entre las que destacan los aspectos topográficos, el estudio de la fauna cavernícola y la calidad de las aguas subterráneas, así como un estudio hidrogeológico y arqueológico de esta zona.

Según anunció ayer Carlos González Luque, miembro del GEIS y director de este programa de investigación, existe la posibilidad de que el Peñañorao sea declarado parque histórico natural. En caso de ser así, se convertiría en el primer espacio kárstico que recibe tal calificación en todo el territorio nacional. «Ha habido intentos de declarar parques naturales otros sistemas kársticos, sin resultado. El último ejemplo lo tenemos con los Picos de Europa, que no acaban de recibir esta calificación a pesar del interés que tienen algunos sectores de que se lleve a efecto. En cualquier caso, si las conclusiones de esta investigación fundamentan que se califi-

fique como tal el Peñañorao, así se hará», indicó González Luque, convencido de que «se llevará a efecto, porque las conclusiones de la investigación prometen ser muy interesantes».

### Editar un libro

Estas conclusiones se plasmarán en un libro, que pretende ser editado casi con seguridad gracias a la subvención del Ayuntamiento. No obstante, podría ser que las conclusiones en cada uno de los estudios aconsejase la edición de

un libro por separado, algo que se hará en caso de ser necesario, según adelantó el director de la investigación.

Esta publicación se llevará a efecto, casi con seguridad, en 1995 o, a lo sumo, en 1996, toda vez que tres de los estudios que integra este programa -arqueología, topografía y fauna cavernícola- se encuentran ya muy avanzados.

También se pretende incluir este valle dentro de la ruta del parque arqueológico de Camargo, centrado en el yacimiento del Paleolítico Inferior hallado en La Verde, aunque éste es «un proyecto a muy largo plazo», según señaló González Luque.

El alcalde de Piélagos, Jesús Angel Pacheco, continúa sin responder la petición de ayuda económica que el GEIS registró en el Ayuntamiento para llevar a efecto la investigación del Valle del Peñañorao. A pesar de la trascendencia que este proyecto tiene para el municipio, Pacheco ni siquiera ha contestado los requerimientos del equipo investigador, bien para denegar la ayuda, bien para confirmarla.

Lo cierto es que ya han pasado varios meses desde que el GEIS le presentó personalmente en su despacho este proyecto, aunque sí es verdad que Pacheco, según ha podido saber este periódico, no mostró especial interés por el mismo y dejó entrever que su equipo de gobierno no colaboraría en esta iniciativa.

El alcalde dijo desconocer incluso en aquella reunión la existencia de agua en el sistema del Peñañorao que, como adelantó este periódico, posee un río interno que nace en el Pozón de La Dolores y desemboca en el río Pas. Ello tiene especial importancia para el municipio como Piélagos, que se abastece de manantiales situados fuera del municipio, con el desembolso que ello supone para las arcas municipales.

La delimitación y futuro aprovechamiento del agua subterráneo del Peñañorao es precisamente el objetivo de uno de los estudios que se integran en este programa de investigación. Por ello, la ejecución de este proyecto adquiere, si cabe, mayor importancia para Piélagos, al ser factible que el Peñañorao abastezca de agua algunas zonas del municipio sin que ello suponga un coste al Ayuntamiento.



A choice between loose boulders or crappy calcite resulted with the latter option. 8mm studs failed to pull out and 10m was ~~used~~ attached to mud/calcite flows. ## La CE podría proteger a medio plazo las faunas cavernícolas endémicas del término municipal

La Comunidad Europea podría

decretar a medio plazo la protección de algunas de las cuevas del término municipal que albergan entre sus paredes especies faunísticas cavernícolas endémicas y relictas al área de Camargo. La noticia ha sido hecha pública por el Grupo de Espeleología e Investigaciones Subterráneas de Carballo/Rada (GEIS), colectivo que ha sido escogido y becado junto a otros dos grupos espeleológicos nacionales para participar en la realización de un proyecto de investigación sobre la catalogación de todas aquellas cuevas que presenten comunidades cavernícolas raras, endémicas o de gran interés biológico.

Este proyecto, que por su trascendencia es el primero que se desarrolla en España, se llevará a efecto bajo la dirección del profesor José María Salgado Costas, de la Universidad de León, gracias a un convenio suscrito entre la Universidad y la Comunidad Europea.

**A comienzos del mes de octubre se podrán saber, casi con seguridad, las cuevas que serán protegidas por la CE a medio plazo**


El GEIS se encargará, por tanto, de catalogar las cerca de 500 cuevas que existen dentro del territorio de Cantabria. Precisamente, algunas de estas cavidades serán las que a la postre sean protegidas a nivel de la CE, con objeto de preservar la diversidad biológica de la fauna subterránea.

Esta catalogación, que se basa en una previa labor de recolección de especies cavernícolas por toda la región, se llevará a cabo durante los próximos meses de septiembre u octubre. No obstante, según ha podido saber este periódico, formarán parte de este ca-


tálogo las cuevas de El Ruso, Los Covachos del Peñajorao, La Cueva, El Pendo, El Juyo y El Río, todas ellas situadas dentro de los límites territoriales del municipio. A esta lista se añadirán también algunas otras cavidades existentes dentro de la región, aunque por el momento no se han hecho públicos los nombres de las mismas. El motivo de que se pretenda proteger estas seis cuevas del municipio se debe a que en ellas han aparecido recientemente nuevas especies para la ciencia, únicas a nivel mundial y de un valor biológico incalculable.

Entre las especies que han sido halladas en estas cuevas tienen especial importancia los coleópteros *Iberotrechus bolivari*, *Speocharis Sharpi Intermedius*, *Trechus Camargoi*, el molusco dulcolola *Zospeum Schaufussi*, los arácnidos *Ischyropsalis Nodifera* e *Iberina Mazarredoi* y, por último, los crustáceos acuáticos *Stenasellus Virei* y *Parastenocarididae Cantábrica*.

Señalar también que todas estas especies han sido catalogadas bajo la dirección del especialista y científico Carlos González Luque, miembro del GEIS.

### El Pendo y El Juyo

La cueva de El Pendo (Camargo) y El Juyo (Igollo) son quizá las dos cavidades locales más conocidas por el pueblo llano, debido a su gran importancia arqueológica.

La Cueva de El Pendo es una cavidad de reducidas dimensiones y se encuentra rodeada por un paisaje muy degradado, con pastizales y bosques de eucaliptos.

Su yacimiento fue descubierto por Marcelino Saenz de Sautuola, un hombre que fue el primero en realizar excavaciones en su interior. Alcalde del Río fue la segunda persona que penetró en la caverna, donde halló, en 1907 importantes grabados paleolíticos en la galería final.

Ello hizo que fuese sondeada posteriormente por Bruil, Batty, Carballo y el propio Alcalde del Río, exploración en la que se descubrieron importantes piezas prehistóricas. Así, se halla un bastón paleolítico de indudable importancia, restos paleontológicos y arte muebiliar.


En cuanto al arte rupestre del Pendo, éste se reduce a un pequeño panel de grabados incisos interpretado de diversas maneras. Para algunos, se trata de una gran rapaza y dos lomos de cuadrúpedos indeterminados. Según otros, sólo habría un ave -probablemente un pato- y un animal de cabeza estrecha.

La Cueva de El Juyo es bastante más incómoda de recorrer dada su estructura laberíntica. En la actualidad está siendo excavada por Gordon Freeman y Joaquín González Echegaray.

En su caso no tiene tanta importancia el arte rupestre -sóloamente contiene un grabado inciso que representa un animal incompleto e indefinido, como su yacimiento arqueológico, que contiene la secuencia del Magdaleniense Inferior Cantábrico más completa de toda la región. Probablemente fue utilizada como cazadero especializado de ciervos y taller marisquero, aunque las conclusiones finales deberán esperar al estudio que desarrolla Echegaray.
