

and up next valley east from Toad.



New site 1282 at ① with twin-trunked holly tree.

Then to dig ②. Pulled out some large boulders until 2 sides would have collapsed. Draughting - needs the whole mess pulled out.

③ is shaft top previously descended by Pete.

Tiamo pointed out a black hole west to Cubio de Seldesabto.

Monday 6/4/98.

+ Penny + Jenny.

Spn. returned to black hole 10m east of Cubio de Seldesabto. Turned out to be 10m long with short crawl at back to nothing. Took a couple of photos in 370.

Had a look at holes at top of "flood overflows"? on the Arenal side. ① drops 3m to v. tight draught slot. Others are interesting.

7/4/98. Ali, Karen, Dave, Lance, Pete, Li, Ross, Martin. 'Valline'
Eight People to 'Sherpa' Seven loads to the upstream
Sump! A good ratio we thought especially Lance who
was the 'negative' Sherpa! His image took a turn
for the worse when his Prototype ff2 was reduced
to a fading glow. His trip was salvaged by a lucky
dip into a tackle bag produced a glowing ff3.


Steady progress was made through the cave ensuring that
Martin and Ross could find their own way without
Sherpa Ali to nosemaid them through on future trips.
Lance was finally forced to abandon his comfort rope
at the oxygen climb, without which he shot off into the
darkness. At the pitch Martin, Ali and Ross descended
with the assorted diving gear which was deposited at a
rather murky upstream sump.

Meanwhile the infamous five explored 600 feet of
passage after one false start.

All eight were re-united an hour later with Ross testing
his route finding on the way out. Pete wanted to locate
an undescended pitch at the end of the Maze/bottom of the roof
area! This was easily located with the aid of the Survey
and Ali's knowledge. (Ali located another promising passage close to the Pitch).
An excellent and productive day's diving which took approx
6 hrs


7/4/98. Andy & Ivan to new dig (1288) in 415 area

Fug down about 1m to rift. No draught but
small chambers can be seen ahead.

9/4/98 Andy left ONAL Petro Igor L.R. & Ivan visited
the above height. It is now written off as small
chamber is in fact an alcove.

③ 8.4.98 Dig (1289) opening 2m wide.
 father and Peter, Andy, Liz, Lark,
 We were walking up the road towards
 Soil in the bag, complete with Bosch Drill
 by (newly repaired) hilti caps etc, when
 Lark had inspiration, so we turned
 up the caravanso track at about 20yds
 along we looked at a hole with
 a view to hilti capping it. Peter headed
 up the hill to do what the best do and
 on the way back found a narrow tight
 shaft with a possible slope at the bottom.

The shaft was 4.8m deep and
 landed on a slope with dry light entering
 from the left this was dug out to
 give a second entrance, as at the
 bottom of the slope was open passage
~~concrete~~ a block was removed.



Easy walking passage up to 8m wide 10m
 high led over dry mat covered floor and
 some blocks to a second squeeze with a
 good draught. Andy returned to the entrance

To get Mash, chisel, and crow bar to open up
the big squeeze once through the squeeze
easy walking led passed various pits in the floor
(which don't look to good) until the roof and floor
meet and close.

A. Visibh is the sun set may find the source of the draught.

A climb up in the roof led to a small
closet area with no draught.

Surveyed out about 130m and back to the road.

A further dig at the entrance slope led ~~up~~ down to 10m of rubble slope with brought no obvious way on.

The whole passage is fairly well decorated with stal gows and some mushroom shaped shafts.

The original reason for going here was to ask the 'boys' for a price for lithi capping another hole just below the above. called 1290 this is about 15 m long obviously connected to the above and does not need following. Calculated newspaper in entrance, draughting is not surprising. See above.

8/4/98 'Valline'

Martin Holroyd - Ross Greenwood

The 1st challenge today was to find our way back through the cave. This was actually done without any serious debours. The Sump was reached in just over an hour. The usual silent chaos followed as 2 divers prepared their lasers and 'Snoopy loops' into the compact position.

Ross led the way through the 2 Sumps previously passed by Ross.

Whilst following through Sump 2 saw Hazel & Ross another away underwater. However it may be that we should continue with the initial objective of diving Sump 3, even though the volume of water did not match that back on the main streamway.

The 'inviting' Sump Pool was easily reached but did not look as good as we were led to believe. Martin dived 1st, immediately the Sump dropped onto a small clamber at -1m depth. The way on was not obvious, but a squeeze down a gravel slope led onto a comfortable sized continuation. The Sump meandered N-NE dropping to -6m then rising steeply up a large silt bank to -2m but no surface. He way on dipped back down again to -6m. At this point the main tunnel appeared to rise up a rill. This was followed up to base then -1m ~~forward~~ but no surface. A parallel rill axis then ascended to a smaller dell but no ~~surface~~ surface. By now visibility was all but gone. The line was tied to a large flake at 3m (6m). Ross joined Martin at this point. Seeing him acting he too he returned to base followed closely by Martin.

A number of climbs, etc. inlets, were explored but appeared to be old airways leading back

into the 16 at Streamway - they go to return to Gull

Back at Sump 2 it was decided to investigate the possible passage seen earlier. Martin dined 1st and at the 30m contour he turned Northwards and entered a large passage. This was obviously the main route. The way forward was a spurious passage invisible except at approx -6m. The passage followed a number of dog legs & still trended N unfortunately the ~~time~~ end of the reel was reached having added a further 50m, Ross was 'treated' to his 1st taste of crystal clear Sump 3 having closely followed Martin.

Back at base it was felt we should attempt a further dive later this week. So 2 cylinders were dropped out. The surface was soon reached without any 'detours' to complete a successful

Vzueka to Pig's Trotter. An exceptionally wet day. Water running in the following places: a substantial increase in water flow during the course of the trip: Large stream entering beginning of Pig's Trotter but mostly sinking before the low continuation of the way on beyond Pig's Trotter. Cascade on left or wall entering the chamber & on the right before the end wall. This last seems to sink in the calcite pool below it as well as in a small tube beyond. Cascade in Flashbulb Hall. Water began to flow in the crossover joint tube in the passage between the Pig's Trotter & Quadraphenia. The lowest part of the passage from the entrance to the Squeeze takes a stream but it sinks through calcite at the lowest point.



Block to Pig's Trotter will out direct by down
the pit goes to the Flashbulb Hall below, and back to the
water. It is best to crawl up to the other again
because there is no gate this is a dolpit. It is a
dolomitized limestone.



Back in main passage a rock tube was climbed but became tight. A side passage was entered with pitch tight at top near entrance,


may not have been descended (very tight).

Dig in passage in terminus pitel led to about 20m of passage at the bottom of a sloping drift. Bottom digging in dry weather could well produce more.






Hammered open patch in second chamber taking strong second draft. Hasdair



Went to point where Ali + others had put in traverse over shaft. (8th April). Descended little shaft at far end. Dropped approx 10m with no way on. Larger wet shaft below traverse descended 22m where it connects* with bottom of ladder pitch St Ann's. but shaft continues another 20m or so (not descended). Very wet like everything else including my sleeping bag. At end of traverse is a choked tube but not draught. Dug out some mud using hands but needs a concerted effort. De-tackled, took some photos and excited to actually find it not raining. Zoë has now become officially hairy arse but needs to dry harder to achieve full bushy bummed with winnett status.

Another 'lightweight' trip to recover the diving gear - uneventful trip to the pitch, however a number of small rivers had begun to flow with a number of new outlets. The river at the bottom of the pitch was a sizable flow and the river Risca Stream was up by approx 1metre. Judging by the foam it had been up a bit higher at some point. The strong current made walking difficult. The diving gear was rescued and the pair exited with 5 loads after a slow 10hr trip.
