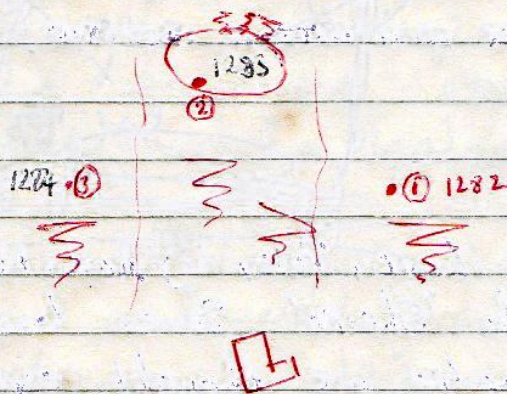

③ is shaft top previously descended by Pete.

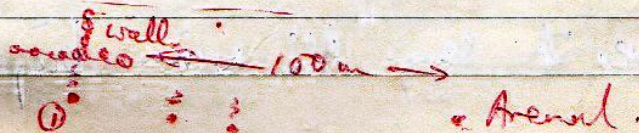
Tiano pointed out a black hole next to Cubio de Seldesuto.

Had a look at holes at top of "flood overflows"? on the Arenal side. ① Drops 3m to v. tight draughting slot. Others are interesting.



7/4/98. RAY + ANNIE + Penny + Jerry

7/4/98. Ali, Karen, Dave, Lenc, Pete, Li, Ross, Martin. 'Valline'
Eight People to 'Sherpa' Seven loads to the upstream
Sump! A good ratio we thought especially Lenc who
was the 'negative' Sherpa! His image took a turn
for the worse when his Prototype fx2 was reduced
to a ~~the~~ fading glow. His trip was salvaged by a lucky
dip into a tackle bag produced a glowing fx3.

Steady progress was made through the cave ensuring that
Martin and Ross could find their own way without
Sherpa Ali to nursemaid them through on future trips
here was finally forced to abandon his comfort rope
at the conger climb, without which he shot off into the
darkness. At the Pitch Martin, Ali and Ross descended
with the assorted diving gear which was deposited at a
rather murky upstream Sump.

Meanwhile the infamous five explored 600 Peseras
passage after one false start.

All eight are re-united an hour later with Ross taking
his route finding on the way out. Pete wanted to locate
an undersanded pitch at the end of the Maze / bottom of the ramp
area. This was easily located with the aid of the Survey
and Ali's knowledge. (Ali located another promising passage close to the Pitch).

Dug down about 1m to in rift. No drought but small chambers can be seen ahead.

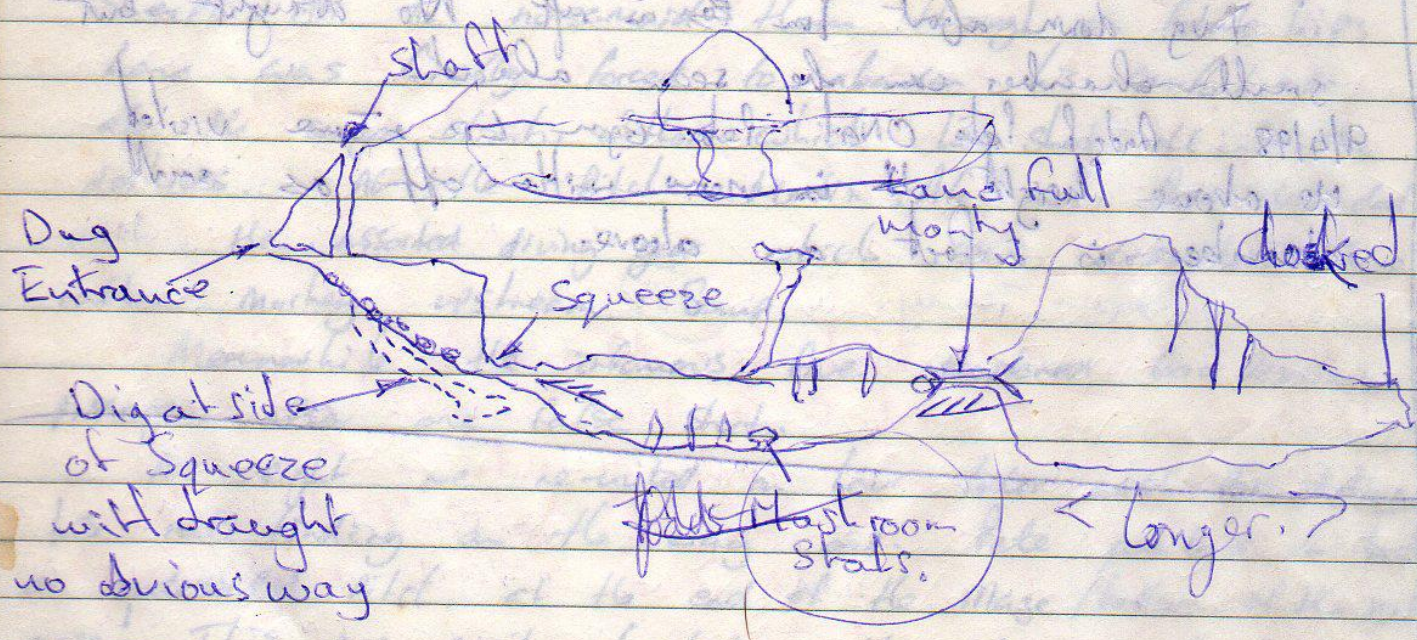
4/4/98 Andy & Ivan to ONeil. Leto Egon LR & Tame visited

Peter, Andy, Liz, Luke,

We were walking up the road towards
soil in the bag, complete with Bosch Drill
(newly repaired) lithium caps etc, when
Luke had inspiration, so we turned
up the crevasse track at about 20yds
along we looked at a hole with
a view to lithium capping it. Peter headed
up the hill to do what the bees do and
on the way back found a narrow high
shaft with a possible slope at the bottom.

The shaft was 4.5m deep and
landed on a slope with day light entering
from the left this was dug out to
give a second entrance, as at the
bottom of the slope was open passage
~~not clear~~ a block was removed.



Easy walking passage up to 8m wide 10m
high led over dry mud covered floor and
some blocks to a second squeeze with a
good drought. Andy returned to the entrance

to get Mash, chisel and crow bar, to open up the ~~big~~ square once through the square easy walking led passed various pits in the floor (which don't look too good) until the roof and floor meet and close.

A Visit in the summer may find the source of the draught.

A climb up in the roof led to a small closed area with ~~no~~ draught.

Surveyed out about 130m and back to the road.

A further dig at the entrance slope led ~~down~~ down to 10m of rubble slope with draught no obvious way on.

The whole passage is fairly well decorated with stal gours and some Mushroom shaped stals.

Have nearly did the full work on the way out ~~but~~ removing everything but the under soil to get through.

Back at the camp the battery/drill connection was found in Lank's tent. Jack as well we didn't need it.

Merlin Holroyd - Ross Greenwood

The 1st Challenge today was to find our way back through the cave. This was actually done without any 'serious detours'. The Sump was reached in just over an hour. The usual silent

class followed as 2 divers prepared their hoses and 'Snoopy loops' into the correct position.

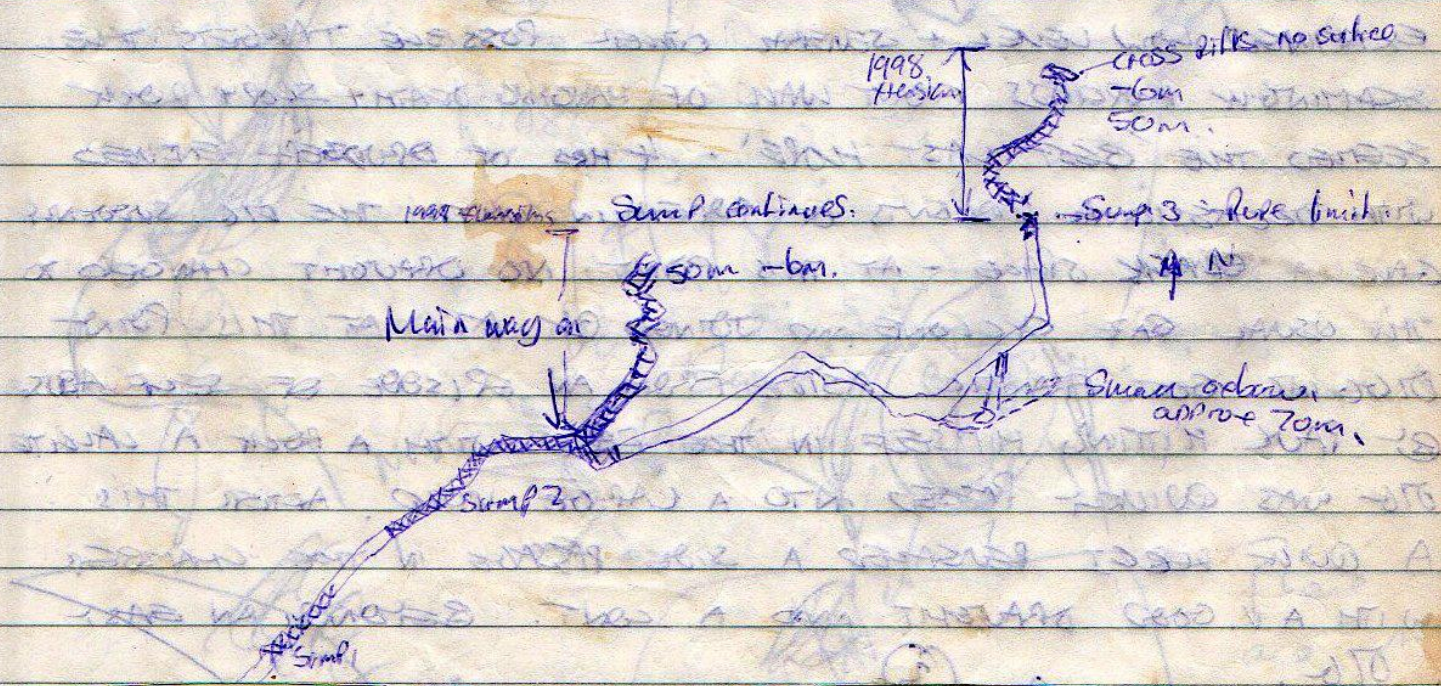
Ross led the way through the 2 Sumps previously pushed by Rufe.

Whilst following through Sump 2 Merlin thought he saw another way in - under water. However, it was felt that we should continue with the initial objective of diving Sump 3, even though the volume of water did not match that had in the main streamway. The 'inviting' Sump Pool was easily reached but did not look as good as we were led to believe. Merlin dived 1st, immediately the Sump dropped into a small chamber at 2m depth. The way on was not obvious, but a squeeze down a gravel slope led into a comfortable sized continuation. The Sump headed N-NE dropping to 6m then rising steeply up a large silt bank to 2m but no surface. The way on dipped back down again to 6m. After some time the main tunnel appeared to rise up a rib. This was followed up to 6m then 1m ~~or more~~ but no surface. A parallel rib was then ascended to a similar depth but no ~~surface~~ surface. By now visibility was all but gone. The line was tied to a large flake at 5m (6m). Ross saved Merlin at this point. Seeing him cutting the line he returned to base followed closely by Merlin.

A number of climbs, ~~in~~ inlets were explored but appeared to be old carbons turning back

into the streamway - ...
Back at Sump 2 it was decided to
investigate the possible passage seen earlier.
Martin dived 1st end at the 30m tag he
turned Northwards and entered a large passage. This
was obviously the main route. The way forward
was a spacious passage in 'blue' water at
approx -6m. The passage followed a number
of dog legs in but still trended N. Unfortunately
the ~~the~~ end of the reel was reached having
added a further 50m. Ross was 'treated' to
his 1st taste of crystal clear Sumps having closely
followed Martin.

Back at base it was felt we should attempt
a further dive later this week. So 2 cylinders
were dragged out. The surface was soon reached
without any 'detours' to complete a successful
short trip. (M.W.)

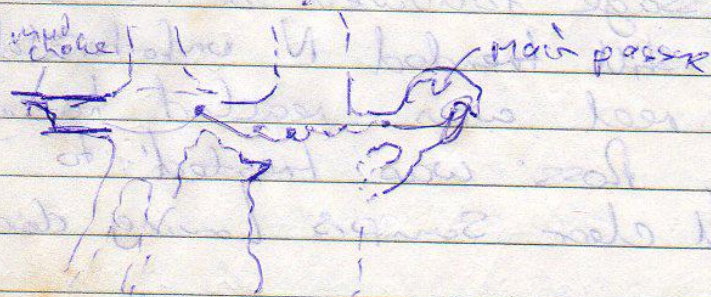

tube - mud choked. Left rigged.

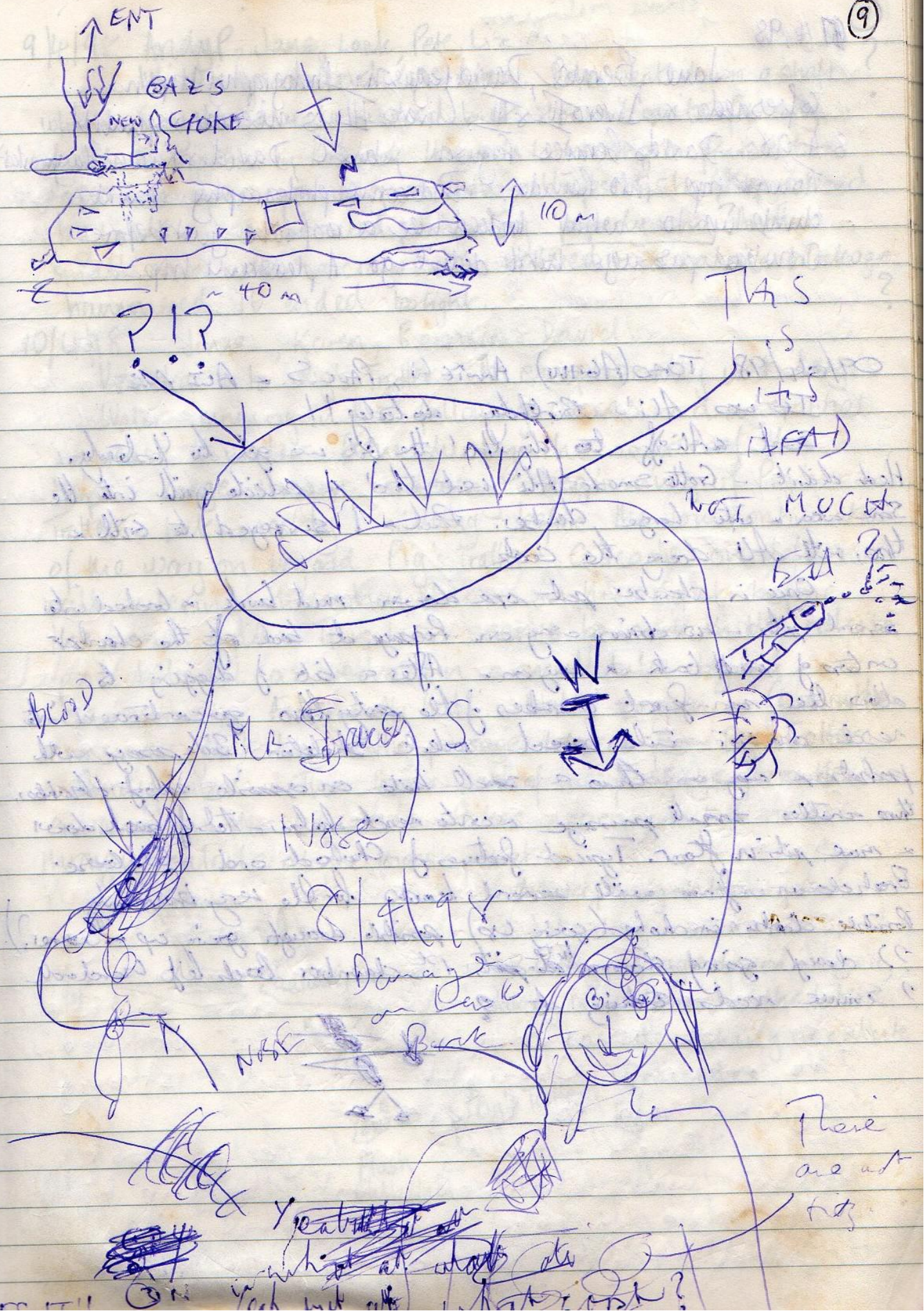

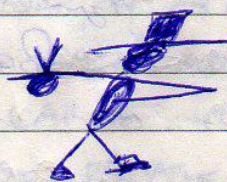

It was Ali's Birthday today!!

Sent Ali off to dig thro' the bit we got to yesterday.
He didn't - Grotto Smoker Ali went thro' a calcite grill into the
same area & into large chamber. Paul & I surveyed to grill &
thro, with Ali doing the work.

One in chamber put ore down mud bank & looked into
several pits - no obvious way on. Passage at end of the chamber
on top of mud bank & way on. After a bit of digging to
allow the non-frock members of the party thro' go continued into
next chamber with bare rock skeleton. Side passage with
pockets & way on thro' a small hole on opposite side of chamber.
thro rattles small passage & into next chamber - top of back down
& more pits in floor. Typical features of Chobed end - At base.
Breakdown in floor with several heads for the very bare only.

Walking around 415 area. Pete went down a shaft which may be already marked but doesn't quite fit any of the descriptions in the book. It needs laddering to finish it - also an open, possibly recently collapsed shaft noticed by Lank. These need positioning properly now? Another small cave with a crawl was entered & a calcite blockage hammered. It ended tonight.

10/4/98 Jane, Karen, Berrice & David.

Vzueka to Pig's Trotter. An exceptionally wet day.

Water running in the following places & a substantial increase in water flow during the course of the trip: large stream entering beginning of Pig's Trotter but mostly sinking before the low continuation of the way on beyond Pig's Trotter. Cascade on left wall entering the chamber & on the right before the end wall. This last seems to sink in the calcite pool below it as well as in a small tube beyond.

Cascade in Flashbulb Hall. Water began to flow in the crossover joint tube in the passage between Pig's Trotter & Quadrephenia. The lowest part of the passage from the entrance to the squeeze takes a stream but it sinks through calcite at the lowest point.

10/4/98 774

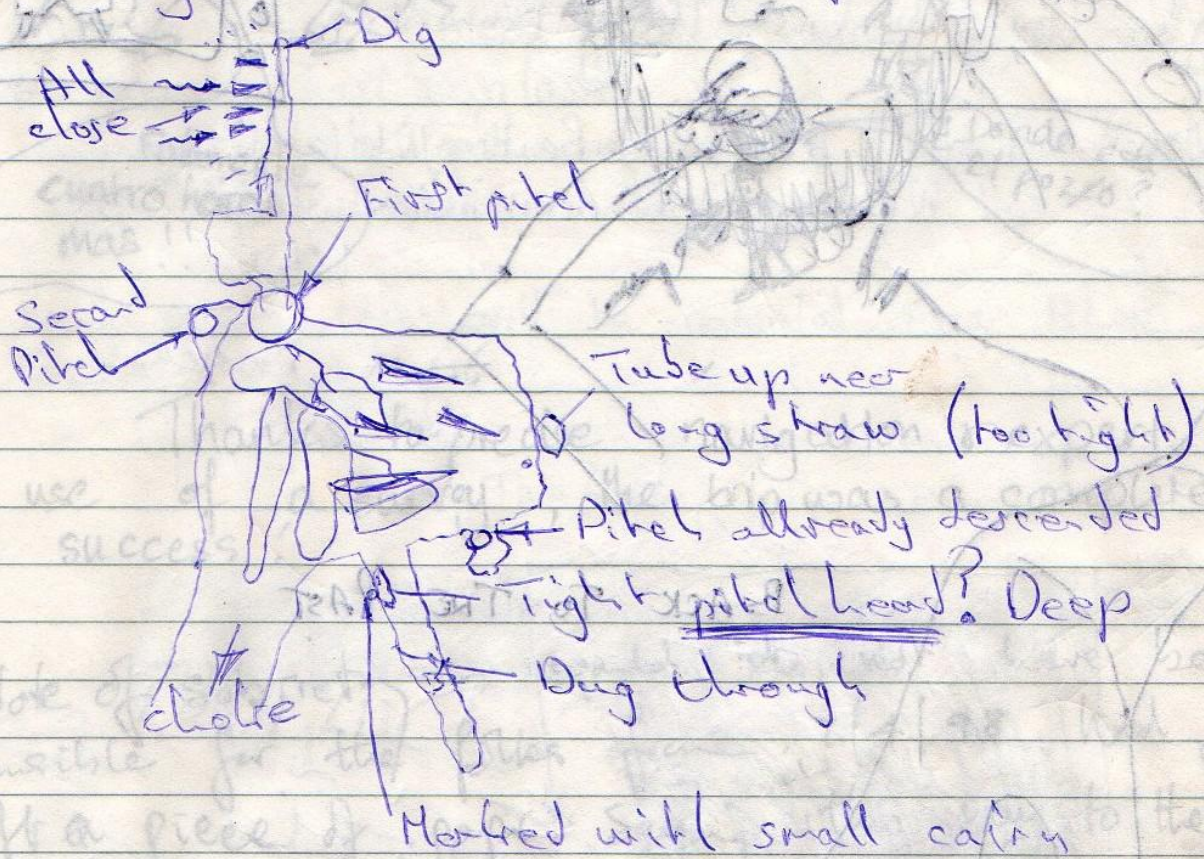

Back in main passage a rock tube was climbed but became tight. A side passage was entered with pitel tight at top near entrance.

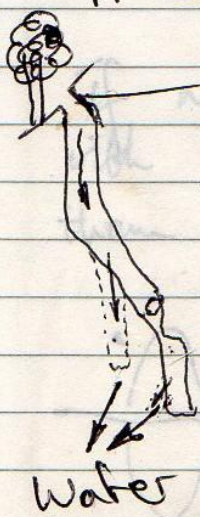

big & waterfall beyond.

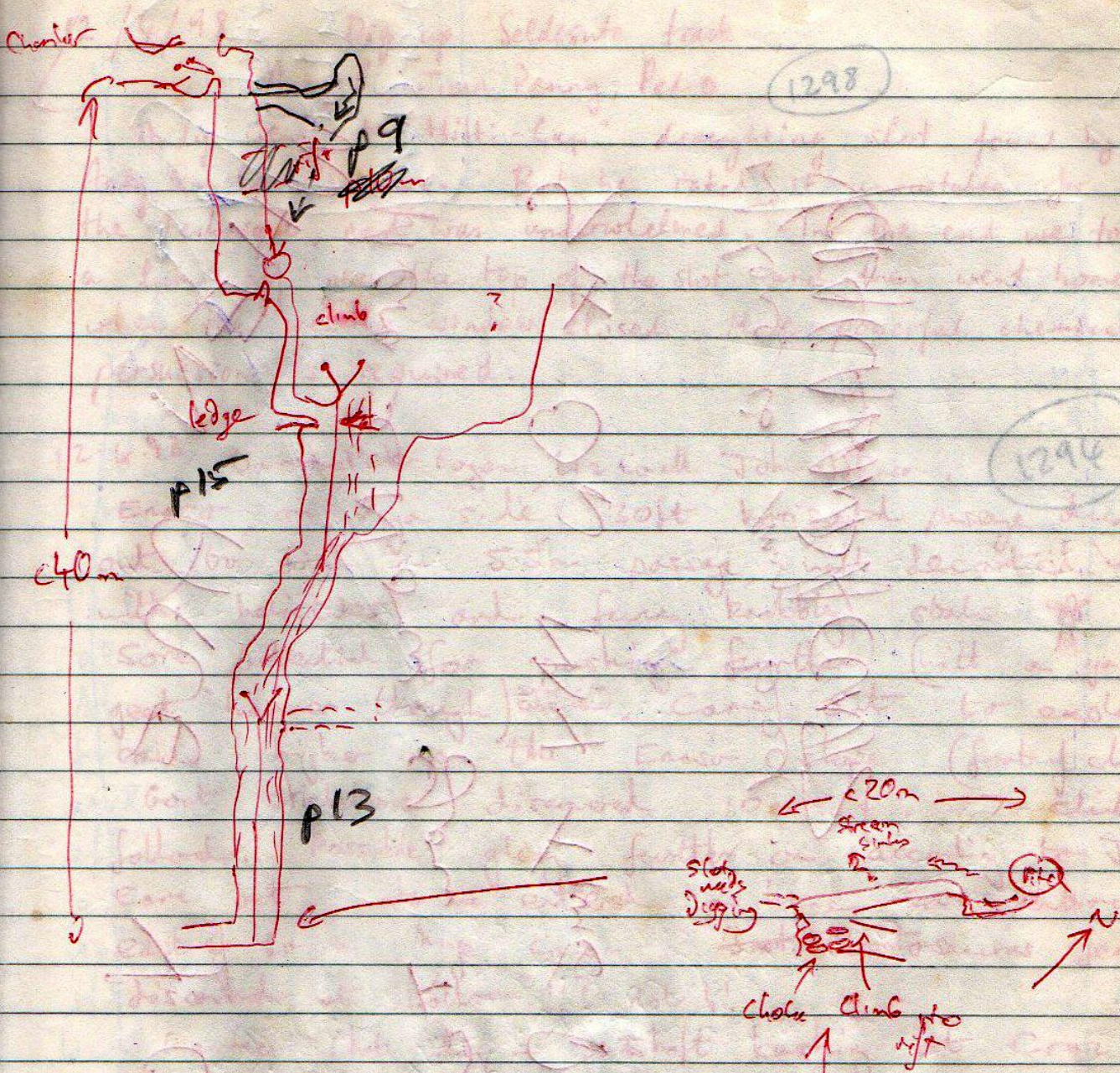
Went into next chamber, where sound of water could be heard from

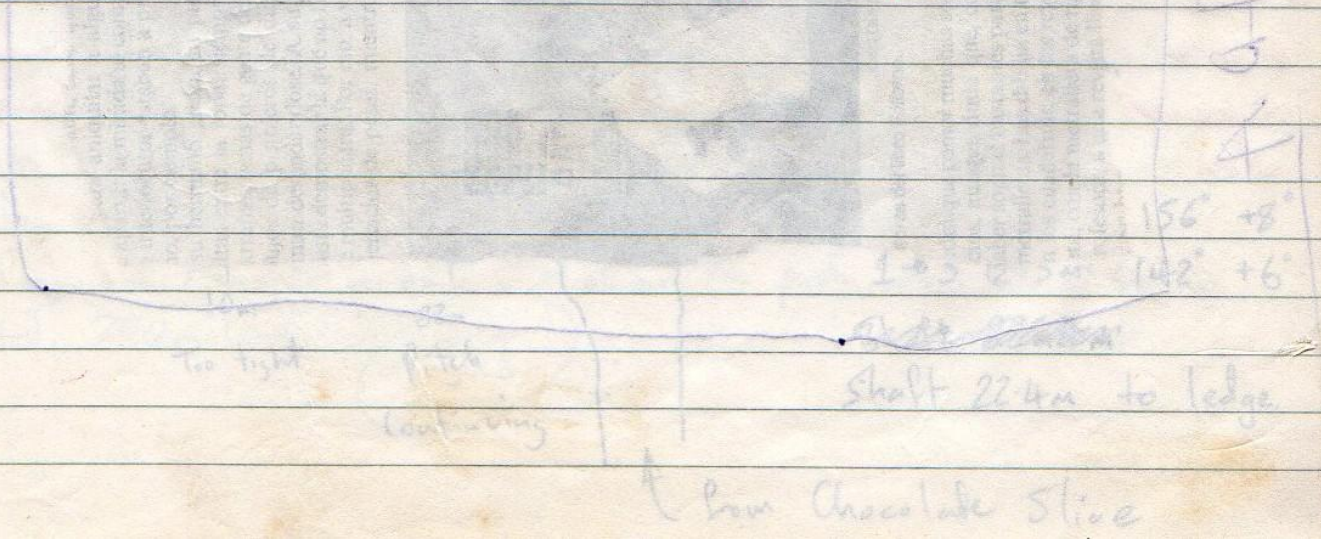

Rift is 25m long and meets a Shaft. Shaft descended $\approx 12m$ but chokes in floor. No continuation of the rift was found but shaft continues upwards out of sight. Shaft diameter is about 3m and wet. No draught. Party left and derigged and Vince winged quite a lot.

13/4/98 VALLING Martin + Ross

Another 'lightweight' trip to recover the diving gear - Uneventful trip to the pitch, however a number of small rivers had begun to flow with a number of wet inlets. The river at the bottom of the pitch was a sizable flow and the main Risco Stream was of approx 1/2 metre. Judging by the foam it had been up a bit higher at some point. The strong current made walking difficult. The diving gear was rescued and the pair exited with 5 loads after a slow 4hr trip.

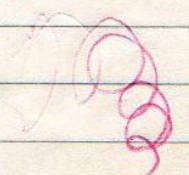
