Finally found time to write up what we found in Mahienzo last month. Enclosed is a blow-up of the Arrendo map, on which I've marked what Andy Pringle and I found near San Miguel, whilst looking for the 'lost' cave I found with Pedro several years ago, which still escapes rediscovery. All the features are near a waymarked path which is part of 'GR75' the 'Senda de los Valles de Cantabria'.

1) Shaft $\approx$ 30m deep, concealed in a patch of rough karst and bushes, on a generally open hillside about 100m beyond a gate in the track up from San Miguel. It lies in a fork between the track and a very indistinct path that takes a slightly lower route.

2) Large chamber, about 30m x 20m, behind a partially-concealed stooping-size entrance in a gully running parallel to the path and about 15m back from it, just behind where the path runs between waist-high natural walls formed by clints (very distinctive). All exits seem to close down. Appears largely undisturbed, may well be an archaeological site - the floor is mainly flintstone. Nearby is a large fissure that might 'go'

3) 'Small railway tunnel' sized remnant passage, just before a LH 'hairpin' in the track. Lies below the path, concealed by a huge boulder. Drops down steeply towards the bottom of the valley below, almost parallel to the surface and also appears to run back under the path, just having been 'derooft' by the path. Not investigated - rope would be useful.

This feature is only about 100m beyond (2).

I'm sure that the 'lost cave' is in this area: feature (3) seemed vaguely familiar: I may have seen it before, on the visit with Pedro. If possible, I intend having another look in February.

We also found an interesting site near Fresno. Follow the dry stream bed upstream for 2-300m and a limestone scar will be met about 3m high, with (in November) a stream forming a waterfall over it and sinking immediately. In the corner next to the waterfall and pool is a low bedding which draughted (not a lot, but air temperature and cave temperatures were very similar) and a choked passage about 2m high, full of sediment. We dug a lot of sand out of the bedding, which would appear to 'go'; but needs a properly organised dig. From what Andy told me of Fresno it looks like it would be an inlet to it, as a stream does come in part way through, and the bedding dips back towards Mahienzo.

22/7/00. Juan, Penny, Jan, and Pete S. to area around 311.

Many entrances were re-located with Juan's GPS. Then Juan and Pete attempted to push, survey and photograph a new cave. 1512. ^[In same shakehole as 308?]
- a crawl-in entrance over top of a pit, to the top of two pitches. We dropped the smaller one on the right, about 5m, to a slot and climb down to a chamber. Water and draughts enter from v. small passages. The way out is down a tight meander, and we could only get half way along. The rock is too hard to break easily with hammer and chisel. It needs Hilti-capping, and/or someone thin and supple. The water can be heard falling a few feet ahead. 1513 was noted east of 179, a fenced-off area with two or three possible entrances - not explored.

23/7/00 Another jolly day out, GPSing and finding new caves. Pete, Penny, Jen + Juan walked up TV mast track and down to TV Mast Cave entrance - draughting out well. Pete has given this cave to the Catalans to finish off. Then headed off towards Coterón but almost immediately came across site 1514 (new). A phreatic cave remnant mainly 3m diameter tube with 4 entrances. Some pottery found but need to return to survey ~80m of passage.

Then carried onto Coterón via 1515 where a more appropriately dressed person might find something at the bottom of a large shakehole; 1516 - 3 holes which may connect. Barbed wire fence runs above lower hole and lower hole is full of barbed wire. 1517 is a hole ^{on} uphill side of shakehole. Flow can be seen a few metres down.

Went to 266 first for a GPS and couple of photos. Ben dropped down to Coterón for the same. By this time the rumble of thunder suggested a retreat was necessary. Pausing to find shaft 1518 below the track ~~and~~ Pete and Juan rushed to catch up with the girls who had run away earlier. Everyone got a good soaking and giant hailstones battering before reaching the car at the bottom of the track.

Returned to German's to find larger hailstones had fallen in La Secada, ripping leaves from the trees, punching holes in Juan's 2CV canopy roof and covering the parasol pitch with a white carpet. Apparently, someone put 2 hailstones in a glass and

couldn't fit another one in.

24/7/00 Pete, Dave (GSS), Penny, Joan, Jenny out in the same area as yesterday, GPSing and finding new cave.

Site 1519 found at uphill side of new barn down from TV Mast track; needs enlarging to descend about 5m. One entrance on top of another.

Returned to site 1518 - shaft with hazel tree in entrance. Dave descended to a choke about 4m down - a fairly typical intro to Matienzo caves. Parallel shaft also appears to choke.

Then headed towards barn well below TV Mast depression and came across 1520 covered with sandstone blocks. Dave was volunteered again but found the shaft top too tight, as did Joan. Pete saved the day and descended 12m to a choke with a tight crack at the southern end. *

Moved on to the main attraction - surveying site 1514 found yesterday. Over one hundred metres surveyed with some bits of pottery (old) found.

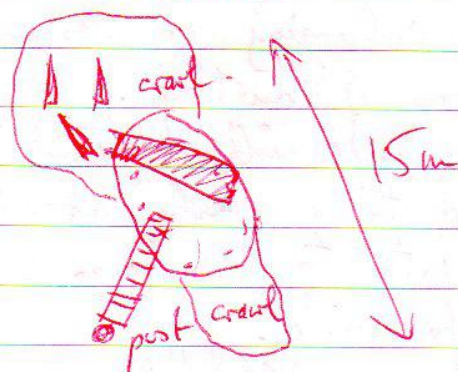
Passage mainly 2-3m high and wider in most places.

Then to site 1515 found yesterday. Pete climbed down at the bottom of the shale into a rift with a 2m climb down to a choke at the end. $L=7$ $d=4$

Walked a few metres to 1516 where only the lower hole proved of any interest. After removing the

barbed wire from the entrance west to a fence, Ivan descended past a dodgy drosses to the floor 13m down. The expected chise wasn't immediate and a duck under 2 sides lead to short as alcoves.



On the way down to the car noticed site 1521 - a narrow shaft with a limestone slab over the top. Underscended about 5m deep.

Then Jenny rediscovered Cueva Aditlo (34) after many years of having only a 6 fig grid reference).

 winding rift between Deep Bullocks Pitch and Spice Pot.

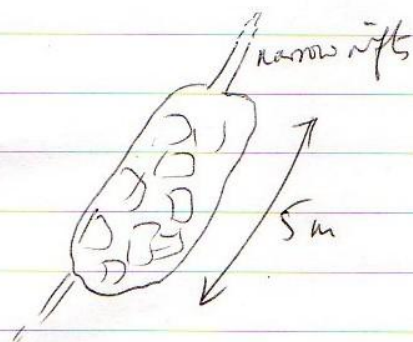

 complete with sketches and 'Lid' off squeeze! Other than a

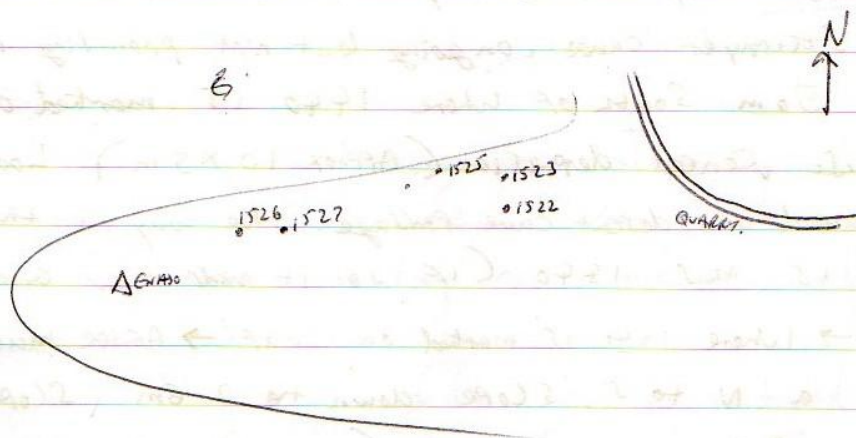
magnitude of 'rat holes' we found a 3 m. wide by 1 m high

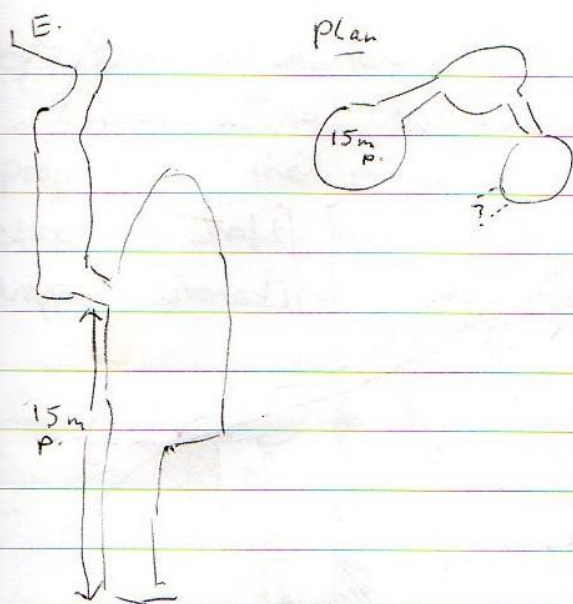

- Approx 50m South of where 1440 is marked on map is obvious fenced depression (Approx 10 x 5m.) Looks like roof has collapsed on descent cave passage. No way on thru. Rubble. No draught.

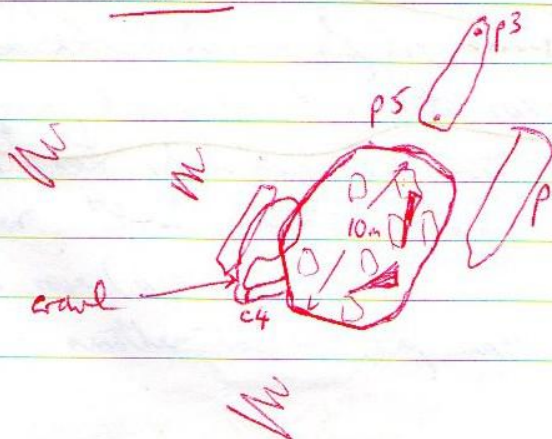

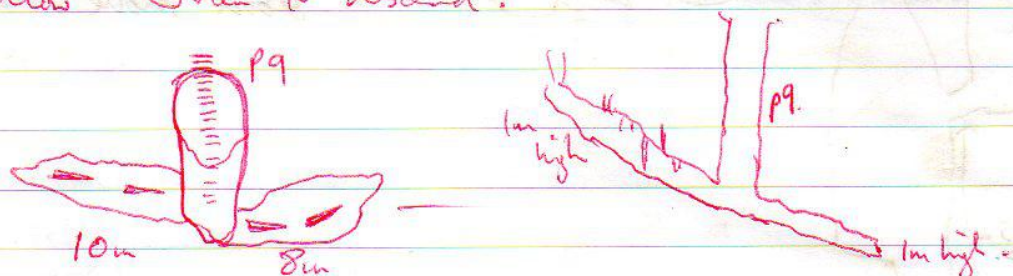

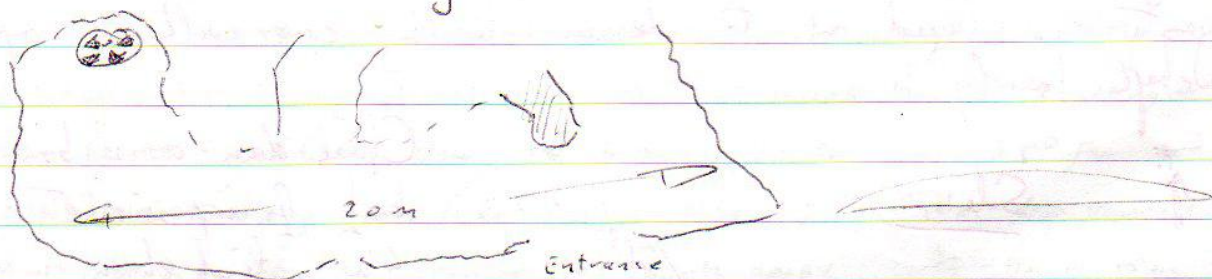
Then to site 1509 where the boulders at the top were removed to allow Juan to descend.

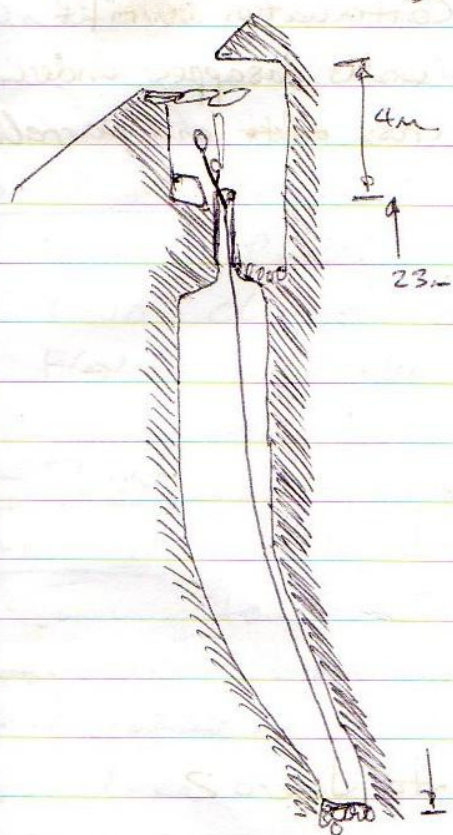

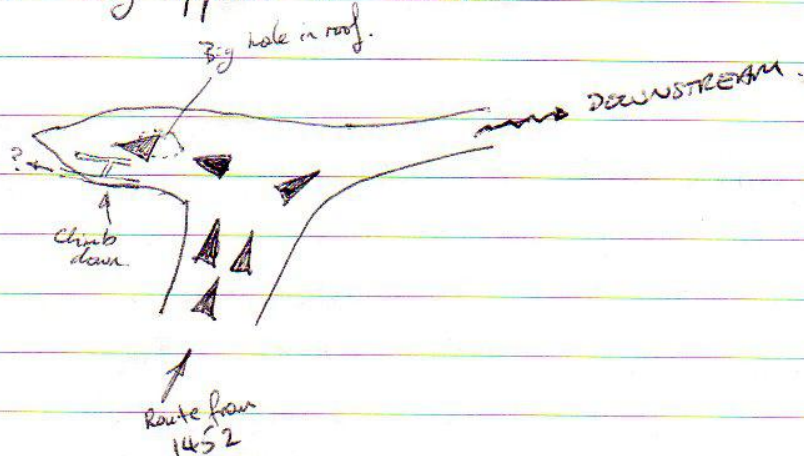

Went to rig the pitch - found it still rigged from Easter but changed the ropes to clean the one in. Eventually found the upstream continuation. Over the boulders closes down but a climb down on the left side before the end goes through a small slot to deep water. Continuation in rift will be for the wet suited only as the walls disappear underwater and the bottom is not visible. There are other cross ~~split~~ and parallel rifts but they appear to choke.

Saw 3 crayfish, one 'real' cave ^{crayfish} ~~creature~~, with no colour, and the other 2 still with some brown colouring.

Went from the top to the bottom entrance, then turned round and went back.

There was also harvestmen, or something similar, about 4" across.

This hole is recorded as draughting well but today was relatively cool. There hardly any air movement in the hole.

We chiseled the entrance out to gain access but the air appears to percolate through rubble. Not very promising.

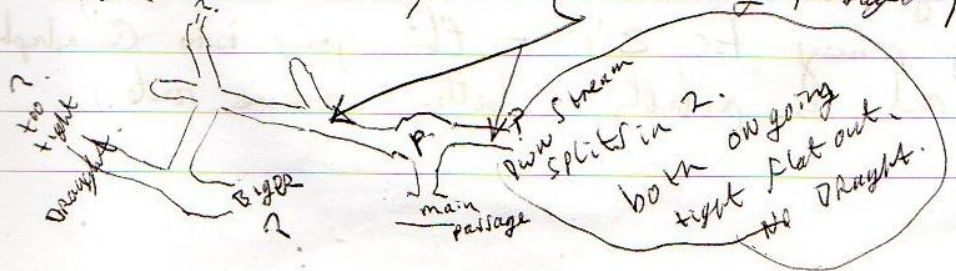

The low level streamway becomes too low downstream. Upstream splits a number of times and links back to the entrance chamber. See survey for detail.

Pete & Phil surveyed bits from the entrance chamber and surveyed the most northerly passage for Z's - this joins into Quadruph past the squeeze and is probably a better rescue route.

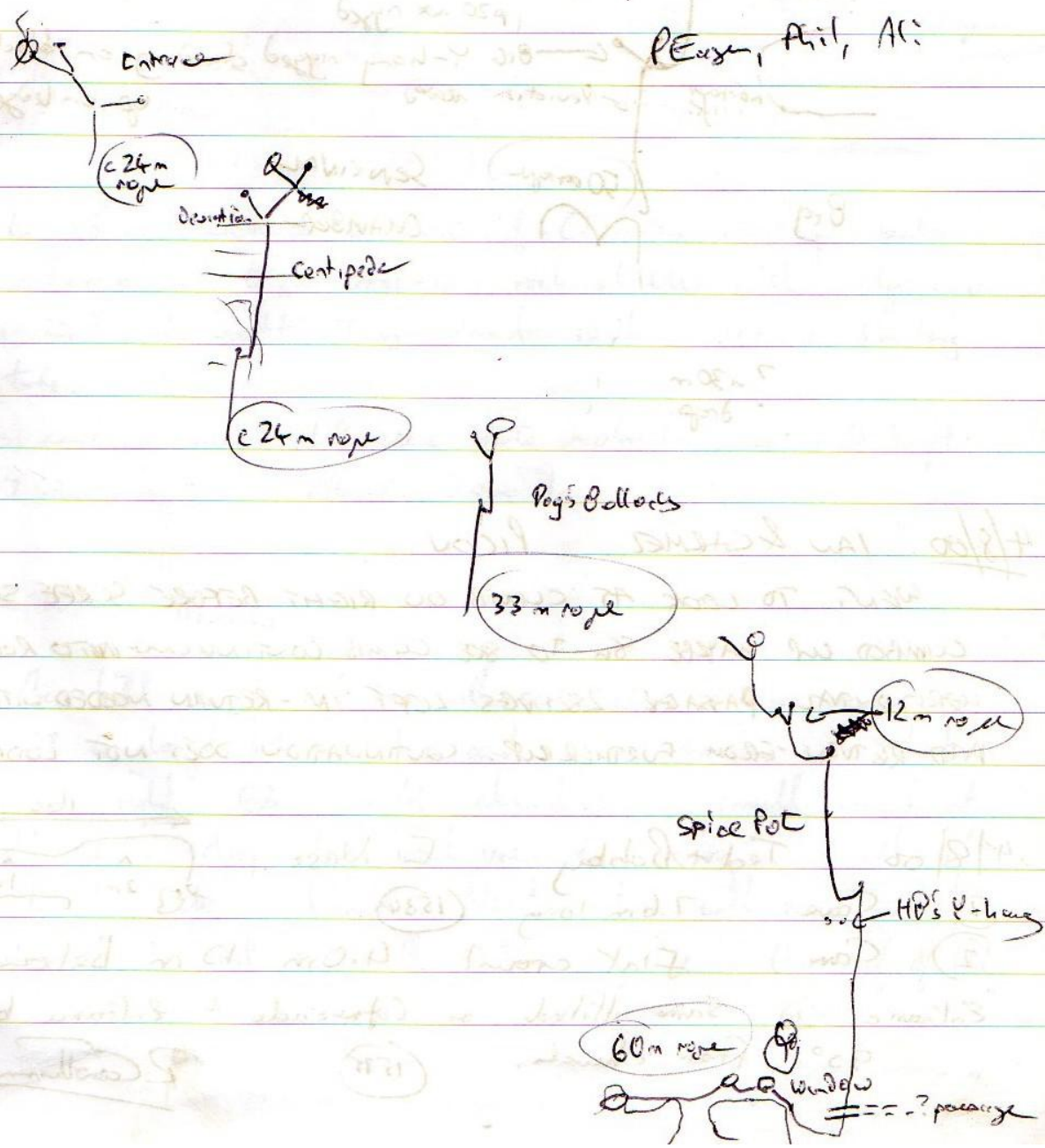

Headed up to obvious entrance to east of Cetralles valley, below cliff face. Turned out to be a roof-less rock shelter with bridge over the entrance. 20m to the ~~west~~ ^{east} Terry explored 1536: <1 1/2> 1 5m long old, small tube.

To the east in same cliff line, Pete explored a room-with a rift cave. - 1537 About 20m long.



Slightly up the hill to a cliff face with scree slope and a number of holes. 1538 is largest hole at base and is a chamber with short passage off to the right. Straight ahead is a small crawl at head height to a drop down and view down along a small rift that seems to drop into a chamber. Needs return with rope/ladder. Up the scree slope to the east a small entrance joins in the roof of the chamber.

Site 1539 is 6m long walk-in fissure.

Then up to Overhang Cave (267), Terry investigating a scoop on the right part way up. Site 1540 to the east of OHC is a 7m long fissure.

On the route to Copudia Pete came across site 1542, a 30m long stooping passage with goss pools in the last chamber.



To Copudia. At the back of the cave found a climb up in the rift which goes over ~~a~~ a couple of drops to where it appears.

But cave might continue down a drop. Ladder/rope needed? to continue down. Needs a return. Possible brought. Photos taken.

On way back down Terry investigated 1541, near top of small near-vertical section. - 15m of head + knees crawling.

Finally Pete re-found site 307, with crazy paving floor and possible rusty Civil War remains.
