

13/4/03 Sunday

Pete, Phil, Hilary, Ivan, Penny, Torben, Jones, Louise and Christina off to Uluera to find 1856 from the bottom end. Parked at the farmhouse at the end of the track that left the Uluera road at a bridge garage. Path through the jungle surprisingly easy going - helped with GPS position - and found the hole, no problem. 4m ladder pitch into oval hole about 4m x 5m with the 60m pitch at the western end.

The shaft (double shaft) is nice smooth. On the floor are the remains of a small animal (rod?) on top of the boulders.

Phil wandered along the hillside to finally discover Siva Canado, (1822) about 23 years after it was described by the farmer to Pete. →

Further up the hill, site 1857 was found up against a cliff face.

A pair of eroded cracks descend about 10m with a connection through.




14/4/03 Monday Torben, Jonas, Louise Clinton digging in Höllen Höle at the "Djordjević Connection".

Many thin layers of calcrete were removed, and the distance to Cefalos was reduced by 5 cm. Then the calcrete layer was so massive that we were not able to break it.


15/4/03 Tuesday

1822 Jonas, Louise, Kristine and Torben descended site _____ about 35 m.



15/4/03 Harry + Lank wandering along S. Vega upto the car park at Sel de Soto and on up the side valley. Lank spotted a hole on the opposite bank, and when we finally got to it, there was a good looking, descending ¹⁸⁶¹ rift with an outward draught. At the junction of the track back down to the car park found a strongly out-blowing undercut that would dig. 1862

16/4/03 Harry, Lank, Tua + Andy P (joined later by Penny) returned to above 2 sites. The first one closed up just part a crawl + split into several phreatic rifts - all too tight. Depth 8 metres, length 6 metres.



Next we dug at the blowing undercut - including going back for drill + generator until we finally could crawl thru to a 1.2 m drop, with a narrow hading rift off to the right (looking in) which was where draught came from, and an over-tight hole on left dropping a further 2 metres (?) - again too tight. The hading rift would probably cap OK. 1862

After this we tried getting Andy stuck at top of a 7-8 m shaft that sounds big below. 1863



1864 Finally went to a rift in field above side track (running above Arenal) and got down 7 m and along 6 m to a choke with possible dig under left wall. →

(2) Hank heard Mr Pringle talking from the ground near where he was resting. A small hole in the grass allowed communication to those below.

15/4/03 Angus took his Discovery up to Arpilicuta to investigate the holes catalogued over the last couple of months.

1858 is a boulder-covered "chamber" at side of Grade. Rocks need removing to explore.

50 Miranda and John Foster extended passage linking to 341 over greasy mud. Pitch and passage surveying.

1859 John found nice entrance rift above Scoura but it only dropped down to an undercut with floor choke. $L = 10m$ $d = 5m$

1113 Eventually found this ~~at~~ one. Removed large block over shaft top SF down, 20m deep, choked

854 Meanwhile, Angus + Dave were removing boulders from entrance of 854. About 15m deep with a flat rubble floor in a $4 \times 3m$ ~~chamber~~ base.

15/4/03 A window about 1m up enters a another small pitch that ends up 2m below previous floor. ~~and Tomas descended like~~

1865 On cliff above Arpilicuta a 2m high 4m long rift which gets too small.

1854 10m choked shaft. Descended by John.

1860 2 holes at top of 10m deep shaft. Choked

339 Choked this out to be 7m deep and choked.


15/4/03 Parts Phil, Andy P + generator later joined by Al & Pete Egan went into space on left previously entered by Hazel.

The draft was coming out of the top of a rift heading into the hill. This project now needs more shoring and could be the ideal spot to try snappers.


17/9/03 Ivan and Penny to Riano to look at the depression 1802, full of jungle. Tried to get in at the base but eventually gave up and walked up the road then down the track to the top of the depression. At this point, the farmer's daughter arrived and showed the best route in. Seemed to end up on limestone surrounded by jungle with a couple of escarpments with possible holes 15m away through jungle. Needs an oversuit.

We were then shown a couple of sites where her dad had cleared the ground and exposed a couple of holes.

1867 is a wall-down 2m wide + high passage to where the route turns left and meets a boulder choke. Cold, but no draught. (Both entrances are above the chicken coop at site 1804).



1866 is probably connected. Entrance is to the NEast - about 15m metres. At 3m slide down a narrow slot to a floor which drops down to ~~at~~ a small, closed chamber. L = 6m depth 4m.




Met the father on the way back who mentioned shafts covered with rocks in front of the beehives. (1870)

17/4/03 Andy P., Lark + Harry eventually set off to Cobadal.
Were diverted from joining Phil + Co. for digging by an
entertaining day out!

First point of interest was sighted for car - low
bedding about 5metre from road edge. Whilst Harry looked
at this, Andy looked at a small, black draughting hole
lower down and declared it is a "goer." 1/4 hr later after
a frantic dig he crawled in wearing his colourful shorts
+ tee shirt, only to return after a few minutes for
better gear. This enabled him to crawl for 12 metres to
the top of a 10-12 metre deep pitch opening to the
right with a traverse on left to unexplored continuation.
Pitch about 5metre diameter with ramp on far side.

1868



Went on down into Cobadal and took road to north
side and parked at farm at end of it. Walked around
to various sites - one with strong outward draught from
fallen blocks requiring lot of work. With a further look
+ number,

Met the "phosphate girls" much to our pleasure -
eldest called Anna, but "no holes on their land".
Walked back towards car along hillside, finding only
one real site of interest, a 2½ metre deep rift - free
climbed by Andy (in shorts!) to a further cork-
screwing passage which was continuing.

Farmer says there are further sites further up the
hill in the eucalyptus trees.

Watch this space for further developments.







As it was noted there was a rope or lead patch from top entrance, we decided to look for top end of D-Flat passage (surveyed last summer). First, ⁱⁿ L-H junction leads to left turn to top of 15m climb down leading soft (handline useful). Through squeeze leads to survey sta. ~~area~~ at top of climb in P-Flat. Straight on at T junction leads to clearer where various leads looked at. A not obvious climb leads to passage passing an 8m undescended pitch. Noted climb into passage at top of slope up from patch to passage going at least 20m - unsure if it



18/4/03 Vallen. Played A Night Angus Louisa Jones & Tobi.

Tobie did climb near top of 3rd pitch (see previous day) - passage went 33m to end. Precariously entered. Next passage on left surveyed into a chamber with a draughting choke - no way on - found. Opposite has some passage with good gypsum formations - all ways choked.



18/4/03 Jane, Lank, Pete, Andy, Terry, Juan + Harry - all "over the hill" to Cobadal and to the cave by the road found yesterday. Pete + Andy assaulted it, bolted it + Pete down the pitch - choked each way. Juan filmed + the rest of us lazed in the sun! Surveyed 1868

Lank, Terry, Jane + Harry then returned to Riana and went to 1805 armed with the drill and phgs + feathers.

These removed a large lump of the offending boulders but it needs more of the same and we hadn't any more battery power as we had used it to open a way down into the slot nearer the entrance. A 2½ metre drop lead to 5 metres of rift heading back to the entrance. It ended at a place where a hammer was needed with another 2 metres visible to what looked like a complete choke.

We then went looking for a shaft that the farmer had told Juan about up near the beehives. This turned out to be $7\frac{1}{2}$ metres deep in 2 steps - choked at bottom. 1870 see sketch

Finally, we looked at the 2 sites Juan had been told about yesterday (1866 + 1867). Got an audible connection between them and we dug at bottom of 1866 trying to find the continuation. With a big dig this may be possible as we reached the point where the wall turned under and the roof had the same anastomosis as in 1867.

18/4/03 Jane Pete & Andy P

Left others after finishing off 1868 and returned to phosphate area. Look at several sites.

(a) 8' Rift seen yesterday. This had corkscrew passage to end in total blockage at mud floor.

Jane did not find any other site on that hillside whilst Andy & Pete were in (a). We therefore went looking on other side of farm.

Pete & Andy went in to (b) resurgence which feeds cows water trough. After digging for 20m through flat out shite in water we went out.

Jane had found a sink above which we expect feeds resurgence. Jane had found (c) site of sand stone boulders. These were removed to allow Andy to enter a \$ rift 2m high by 1½ m wide and 4m long. There was a slight draft which most ~~had~~ pass between the many boulders.

(d) Next site was large rubbish dump in shake hole with walking size vadose passage going off Rubbish all over the place. Pete & Andy turned round at climb down. Next side (e) was a shake hole with draft coming out of slots in rock face and very cold & very strong draft coming out of small hole at floor level.

1874 Andy declared this is a stonker we will return see tomorrow's account.

19/4/03 Andy P, Heskey, Jane & Toby C, Steve M. Cobadal.

Dug out the draughting hole we found yesterday ¹⁸⁷⁴

This yielded quickly to Heskey & Andy's attack with shovels, meanwhile Jane & Steve went & finished off the disgusting rubbish tip cave next door which fortunately doesn't go ¹⁸⁷³

Jane stood on the top rungs of a ladder to allow Steve to climb down into a rising passage lined copiously with decomposing trash which mercifully rose swiftly & choked. Hesky & Andy soon managed to insert themselves into a hands & knees crawl in the draughting cave which then lowered to flat out and was dug through by Heskey to a short section between mud banks breaking out through boulders into a sloping streamway. This got to walking size before a collapse from a chamber in front and a wriggle down through boulders into a meandering streamway. This went on but eventually lowered just before an inlet on the right came in. We went up this until it lowered to hands & knees &

then decided to leave things until tomorrow & come back with a survey set & do it properly. It feels like 150-200m has been found but we'll know properly when it's surveyed.

a It's only 70 to 100m & is part of a cone Terry found last year, but did not push as the geologists told him it was not worth it.

20/4/2003. John Miranda & Alama went to Cueva del Picon however, they went to a little higher up the hill (by mistake) which proved to be a "new" 60 ft deep shaft, with 'nada' at the bottom directly below the pylon!

20/4/2003 Steve Penny, Ivan + Terry. Into Orchard Cane (618) to video and position, vaguely hoping to come across the team in 1874. Then tried to find Cueva Torcida (Fat Boy) 613 at the quoted position but eventually discovered the large phreatic remnant about $\frac{1}{2}$ km away. Impressive site that requires return.

20/4/2003 Harry on solo walkabout at Riano. Nothing very exciting, but a hole right by track where it passes between the Riano rising and the "window" down to the sump - marked X



21/04/03 Lank, Terry + Harry back to 1805 for another session with the plugs + feathers. Removed enough for Terry to get thru' - down below no go! blocked with big slabs - up into chamber leads to a continuation of the rift. Hammering produced a few feet of progress to a stal. boss that required stronger measures so he returned for me to have a look. On getting to the 'end' the cave started talking to me! It was Lank in 1804 and without him going through the squeezy bits he could see my light. I think the draught, which was reversing, was mainly coming up from a lower level.

From there we went to the second depression on fm. site 100 and after talking to the locals we pulled enough debris out to produce a draught. Would need an 'organised' dig to continue.

Spent rest of afternoon in Uzuka playing in the entrance passages.

Team Pringle left a few obscure side passages for want of a strongly draughting day before inserting themselves into extreme mud & misery. The surveying went like clockwork (in this digital age) with the teams finishing exactly together at Snottite Junction.

Found 4 sites on beyond Arenal - marked A, B, C + D on enclosed map.

(1896) 'A' was a 4 metre drop under a sloping outcrop at top of a small gully, Blowing out a cool 9.6°C (outside temp. 18.5°C),
 'B' was a hand+knee crawl-sized opening bending sharp right after 2 metres + then slightly left into a small chamber. This was also blowing out fairly well.


(1897) 'C' was higher than 'B' and to the east and is a low opening under a scar. flat out crawl down dip of bedding choked after approx. 4 metres - no draught on a hot day, or echo.

(1898) 'D' Slightly higher and to the east of 'C' is a small sloping tube choked completely 2 metres in - no draught.

23/4/03 Ali, Pete, Lark + Harry to Sel de Soto to look at the above and also site 1863 from 16/4/03. Pete got down - OK to diggable rift at 6.2 m depth with a slight draught.

'A' from yesterday was about 3.5 metre deep - awkward at the top, to an enlargement with 2 over-tight holes. The one parallel to the scar may cap, and seems to open out a bit approx. 2 metres ahead. The other back in to hill was where


New ropes taken in as previous trip had made them very greasy from slime on rock. Hand line recommended from entrance as very slippery. Smaller bypass to the main "ladder pitch" decided. One bolt put in. Bags used as protection. Better rigging required. Main chamber water dropping into pool at base of pitch. Main chamber slopes steeply to a small hole in boulder choke. Some remained and 2 bolts put in for outward 7m pitch into small chamber. Various light tubes off with all too light. Draught felt coming from the floor which enters a thin vadose beyond. At the top of main chamber boulder stop in opposite direction. Thrown rocks rumble for a few seconds.

This was not descended as lack of time.




