

23/7/04 After Ian decided house painting was more important than grafting, Ali, Carmen + Juan went into Cobadal with the intention of surveying the downstream out of the sandstone chambers beyond "Big Keyhole".
Carmen + Ali - crawled up 150ft of passage to be rewarded with huge booming echoing avens, stamping of into the distance.... well 25ft round the corner it ended in a 60ft high Circular Avn, possibilities of high level passage being climbed (bolted) to the right. Surveyed back through crawls, + at 10' further 13 + 10. (17.07.04) We seemed to spend a lot of time in passages that looped around 2 little inlets + ultimately kept ending up in the same place via different routes. (Thank god Tom stayed put for 2 1/2 hrs, waiting or id have been o. lost!!).

24/7 Ivan + Perry prospecting in gorse + on sandstone to the south of Cobadal. Sites 2085 + 2086 (fenced depressions filled with ferns) appear most unpromising.



25/7 Ian C, Jenny C, Kenny C + Juan C to Alias to bid off some shaft. First few in lead below Alias

2035 - 20m long shaft with 20m high limestone face @ N end.

Laddered at S end: 5m drop onto soil and boulders with holes down on W side. Waterfall at N end sinks in a mess of boulders + sediment.

All holes down seem to choke with the same rubbish.

2036 - 15m to the W. Another rubbish dump



9m pitch, unconnected - choked.


2037 - 3m drop - choked.

Then walked over to site 2042.

Dam entrance slope

to meet cross rift.

Dam to N, ladder over boulders into "chamber" with 2 "inlets". Undescended pitch to the N is tighter and about 5-6m deep to a bouldery floor.



25/7/04 Cobadal Pete Hael, Tim Allen, Pete O'Neill

Made our way in to Pinnacle Passage and started to check side passages. At the first T-junction, only one leg from the station 228, was a passage on the left. Surveyed through a complex maze back to the ladder at the start of Pinnacle passage.

At a climb close to the T-junction we climbed up past a dubious flake 12m into a very good looking high-level passage with a flat roof. Unfortunately, after a short moment of excitement it closed down after 40m but there was another bouldery climb back down to the small chamber at Sta 228.

Then we proceeded to Rat junction via Birthday Passage, with some confusion at Sta 180.

Our objective was an 8m climb at the end of a branch at Rat junction. After some preliminary investigations we managed to get the top rung of the ladder over a small stal half way up. Then from a ledge half way, managed to throw a rope through a thread at the top. A rift passage started well but after a 5m climb degenerated to a narrow rift, closing down after 50m.

The Third Objective was to have a look at passages checked by Pete Eagan + Ali last week on 17/7/04.

Pete and Pete went left passing into a

bouldery chamber with an inlet up on the right.
 ↗ Narrow after 10m needs digging. Stream sinks under the wall (now down) on the left.
 In a further chamber ~~is~~ a stream inlet on the right end at a dig - not draught.
 Just beyond, straight on a rift splits in two after ~~After~~ 15m. R/H chokes, L/H continues 5m to a further split left is low and wet, too small right a boulder bars access to open passage with a draught.

Following the second stream down, leads to a complex area of breakdown surveyed by Ali ^{caveon} at 23/7/04. A way thru to 3rd 180 and also a downstream way on.

Right hand branch of Big Keyhole. Followed footmarks as Pete C + Pedro crap survey. Near their end point climbed down and found cairns. Beyond 2 cairns unexplored hole lead into virgin passage. 2 ways - flat calcite floor to blockage to right. Left up into big chamber with calcite inlets flowing across floor continuation on far side not entered. Returning tomorrow. Surveyed to choke at end.

25/7/04 Cobadal Ali, Torben, Carmen & Andyl.

This note is only to detail progress made in choke at the end. Ali to write up rest of the trip. From large boulder chamber with survey station there is a slot into the choke. A cairn in this slot worked to out of Pete & Gor's progress. Two small boulders were removed from the slot to make entry present. Inside a mud floor runs to the left + right. Left leads to climbs up between boulders following the draft. After a climb up

Andy P could not fit through horizontal gap in boulders. Carmen went through this to more up slope over mud to a blockage above. Below the horizontal squeeze on the L.H.S. on our return. (ie going into the choke.) is a mud floored chamber. At far end of this is a flowstone wall, above this are many boulders. Enough of these were removed to allow me to see a solid wall beyond. This can be seen to rise, with draft coming down. More boulders will have to be removed before access is gained. A further game of "Klipplunk" is planned. It is estimated that we have gone up 30-40 foot from the slot at Pete Ogar's, cañon.

P.S. Do not bother with right hand side just a side to slot has the has been shown to and below the "Klipplunk" dip.

26/7/04 Ivan, Penny + Andy Pringle - surface grabbing in Cobadoal. Parked at end farmhouse on S side of depression and climbed up to fenced shaft 917, quite close to the Sandstone Chambers in the cave below. Andy descended into a 12m choked shaft. Just below this on a downhill side of track is site 2026. This was attacked, opened up and then filled in as the roof collapsed. Needs strong measures to remove 2 large lumps over the top of the entrance slope. 80m NNW, just down from a burnt tree is 2 sandstone blocks covering a 3m light drop (site 2087 - not descended, but appears choked).

Then decided to go to the usual farmhouse car park to visit sink beyond. On downhill route, found




27-7-04 COBERDAN - TORBAN, PETE HALL, TIM ALLEN, PETE O'NEALE

Tim & Pete H to RH branch of Keyhole passage, Torban & Pete O' to hill cap boulders above stream beyond 2nd chamber in LH branch of Keyhole passage. Tim & Pete H surveyed 95mtr beyond previous limit, ended at wet areas. Torban & Pete O' capped boulders and joined by the other 2 eventually entered upward trending passage for 15mtr approx (TOP TIP PASSAGE) blocked with breakdown. A ten foot climb in TOP TIP to open passage on LH side as you enter has not been climbed.

The dig is located about between 1930 & 1931 on ~~the~~ the
south side of the fence and a firestone type is put
at the dig. Needs GPS locating.

Walked up the valley 100m south of # P31 towards
#920 and #921 (No progress, did not look promising)

From #921 walked 100m south to the powerline and
walked about 650m east along the powerline. We should
have used a bush knife! From there about 400m
north and back across the field to Cobadale farm /
car park.

1930 Cueva Cobadal-Downstream choke 28/7/04
Pete Hall + Tim Allen.

Having reached the entrance, Tim went back to the farm and fetched his tobacco.

Reached the final choke in 50 mins and started to investigate the upper part according to Andy P's recommendation. We weren't impressed. Tim stuck his head through where Andy had been digging on 25/7 but it was choked over-head and too difficult to dig further.

Back at the final station Tim did a circular tour of the choke emerging back at the final station

Meanwhile Pete re-examined the low level where the water goes. Having got stuck Tim took over and passed an awkward W bend while Pete fetched the digging tools. After 20mins Tim had passed the choke and on his return, Pete had bypassed the W-bend.

We started again surveying forward. There's only one squeeze left but it would be difficult to widen out. Beyond the stream descends steeply to the head of an 11m pitch. To the right, ~~a~~ a passage leads to the top of an alternative 8.5m pitch and another 4m pitch, both in a chamber apparently near the bottom of the 11m pitch.

Back at the 11m pitch, Pete attempted to climb down a wet chimney and got to within 10 feet of the bottom before it went overhanging.

Made our way out in about an hour to be greeted by a shower of rain.



TORBER, ALI, CARMES, (JESSY), CAROLINA, ANDY. P.)

Ali dog through choke at end of Barren rubble (A) to emerge into large chamber with deep pots following into floor (B) Carmes climbed down & traversed RHS looking for a continuation which cuts across the bridge and back up the far side continuing at the same level as he entered the chamber. The passage is continued through another boulder choke to a wide low side passed passage with meanders in the sand, to open up in another chamber with another deep hole in the floor. This was traversed on the ~~left~~^{left}, avoiding many deep holes in the floor to continue to the cañon at the end, with a 30-40' drop - impassable without formed ladders. Torber + Ali scoured out with Carmes checking all holes for a possible place climbable route down to camp -

A team of 6 returned the next day with ladders + rope to push the camp + do photos - (see Torber's Pics) Torber pushed down a ladder rigged in through one of the many holes in the floor that took us to ditch 15 ft of floor of camp to a continuation at a lower levels with..... more impassable holes in the floor requiring more tackle - we will return when the team has recovered from the bruises & scrapes from 250m of barren rubble.



(A) on survey opposite - several small draughting holes on L.H. wall, first dug - small but may open up lead.

(B) of passage - continuing dig, cannot see far for amount of stalactite.

(C) - Paradise chamber surveyed. Crawl entered by Trish Browning last summer to constriction - passed by Carmen, passage continues (^{L.H.} beyond), draughting in.



Draft comes from section AA. A hour was spent removing mud & rocks to allow us to look along mud filled passage with draft coming towards us. More work is required but it should be easy digging.



31.7.04 Vallenca - Barney bubble Extension. Ali, Camer, Pedro, Torden.

Entered passage entered by Torden or 29° - This is a separate lower passage from the big canyon - 10 m pitch at end dropped to small choked passage. One passage on left unexplored - may need rope to cross holes in floor.

The floor of the big canyon can be seen from slope down into passage.

(crossed the bridge) Khazad-Doom & made some progress with the traverse of the pigs along ledge on R.H. side of top of the canyon. Probably have to descend c15 m then descend pitch of c15-20 m to gain the floor.



31/7/04 1930 Covo Cobadol - PP; Slave "O"; Kav; Jerry & Carol
Aim - to find some cove grabbers may have left.

Down "main" stream route & looked at orchards entrance ridge of Gabbons
Cave - No high level passages found going downstream post grabbers
above - seems to be single passage, no roof or high floor until you
get to pitch. Two miles Cobadol - one surveyed a little.

29/7/04 COBADOL Tim A, Pete H, Pete O.

A "key" day in Matienzo turned out not to be. Survey
had shown downstream choke to be deeper than
Regaton and 4.5km to Agua Negra. High expectations
led us quickly back to the choke and the top of
the undescended pitch. Pete Hall was first to descend
into the shower along side the wet pitch. At
the bottom the way on was under the deluge
and down a boulder slope. The bottom leveled
out and the water sank in a small hole. Along
side was a dryhole cutting under the wall.
Unfortunately it choked completely with no
draught. Back the otherway towards the
dry pitch Pete Hall pushed a narrow rift +
slippery climb up into the base of the dry
pitch and again no way on. Surveyed and
returned through the choke. All then went
"upstairs" to look at the source of the draught
climbed up to highest point where the draught
comes from large gaps between blocks and
the roof, which is best location for dig.
Surveyed down and out.



High level route explored at Easter was not entered but still has rope on. 2 leads remain up there + surveying.

1/8/04 Torben, Ali, Juan to Torren de Ria. Ali + Torben rigged 107 pitch + top of next 90m drop ready for another afternoon out and re-exploration. Video.

Squirrel guided Ivan + Penny up the hill to 356 area up to the west of Coberryo. Visited 2122 first a



set of 3 small pleach tubes at the top of the granary slope in vegetated small corrie.

Then around the corner to the west to site 356. Small entrance onto a slope down to the left which enters walking size, well decorated passage about 25m long. On the left at the end is a clay closed rift that may dig. This has a hole over the top but stones don't go any distance and there is no draught.

Climbing straight up the steep slope to a single tree reveals site 2123 a small tube, 3m long and closed.

23/8/04 After a compulsory blanco, Squirrel, Pete + Ivan drove to Cueva del Campizo @ Cobodel. Pete went down the 8m pitch at the end to find water draining away and a ledge with a closed passage.

Video out. + photobed some helictites missed by the last team. On the way to the cave, Pete pointed out a fenced shaft (2124) which had been dug by him + Andy P. ~~Nearby to the SW is another fenced hole (2116)~~

24/8/04 Penny, Ivan + Jenny on Graso. Just before the summit came across a 2m deep hole with a rift at the back that needs investigation (site 2125).

Also noticed an "unknown" cave entrance on S Vega about 300m east of Abono 33.
