

Mody 31st May Sumider de Cobadal Phil, Fan + Tran. - Sare the old clap a small album of Pete Eagens photos and then entered the care with the intention of "closing the loop." This was done with no problems. Ascended the nift that Neil & Becka had surveyed and Rete Suill had broked at. About half way up on the right, a rift goes off through a hyster sertia to where it opens out above a 5m ptrh. Phil put a both in at this point and we dropped into open parage, going in both diestrois. Headed off to towards Marlins and Tin's last survey station and Cambered up the boulders to find the piece of paper. (Station 228).


We then consulted the survey and decided that a bit of gradbeing was in motor and when went to the timb good lead marked on the survey.

This went from station 219 and two-red out to be mainly walking passage to a bouldery area that concerted to station 180 where Martin and Tim had climbed out of the Streamway up towards Rat Junction. About 300m was surveyed in this loop - called Rithday Passage Euroeyed in this trop - called Brithday Passage (Ian's 6(st). On the way back to the ladder we surreyed the 80 or so notes to close the loop and then headed beyond the ladder pask pinacks striking up from the About Jom Leyond a dawy, calcited choke was met with possibilities at vort level and beyond. One of those rare trips where everything went according to bullstirt.

Fresnado II - Not Worthwhile Passage (second one?)

Saturday 10th April - Jim Davis, Neil Pacey

On a previous trip we had noticed a black hole going up above Worthwhile passage, in the entrance series of Fresnado II. After a late night and a slow start we decided to take a drill and give it a go. Jim freeclimbed the first section with ease. This led into a long gallery with two inlets coming in on the right hand side. These were examined but found to be far too small. The left passage of the gallery led into a chamber with steep, muddy walls. Jim bridged up the steep muddy sides, but only made it to the top after digging steps into the mud with a bolting hammer, unfortunatly the top was only an alcove and so had to downclimb using the rope for a handline.

I decided to climb up a steep slope back in the middle of the passage, this led up for about 10 metres to another tight inlet. Above was a boulder jammed in the rift, it looked like there was a chamber behind but the boulder was too large to remove without chemical persuassian. Jim joined me and started shining around with his powerful light. He spotted a rock bridge up in the roof, but couldn't tell if there was a passge going off above. There was only one thing left to explore so we put a bolt in and set about trying to climb up onto the rock bridge. With the aid of a sling i stepped up and mounted the bridge. The other side was a pitch straight back down into the chamber. I placed a bolt and bridged over the top of the pitch. Off to my left was a steep muddy slope leading up into a passage. I climbed up into the chamber with the large jammed block. I could see Jim's light directly beneath me. On the return i noticed another ramp leading off. I followed this for a short distance into a small rift. The rift popped into the bottom of a large walking size pheatic tunnel. I followed it to a choke in one direction and a low dig in the other. By now my light had started strobing, this was a suttle way off telling me it was time to go out. I made a hasty retreat back to Jim and informed him of the news and my imminent light failure.

We returned the following day, with Tanya Savage and climbed back up into the roof tube. I rigged a rope down the other side making this into a straight forward pitch up. Jim soon dug out the low crawl, this led into a chamber with double avens and another crawl leading off, this led into another aven. All of the avens were climbed and tree roots were noticed at the top of one of them, We surveyed back out , and derigged the pitch on our way back down. All in all a nice bit of passage but not worth all of the effort getting to it!
