

Hi Juan,

Not quite sure which one 3500 is, I think these would all have been Earby/Chris Camm finds. It could be the one Chris/Gordon were digging at the bottom of the cliff face.

I'm pretty sure 3501 would have been the short cave explored by Phil Parker, and 3502 the one pushed by John Southworth down a short climb. Both would probably have been originally the same passage, no sign of draught.

The general line they are on -i.e. 3051 and 3502, might repay another look, perhaps mid winter, the jungle was too thick to break through and follow the top of the cliff line, as they'd be over the top of any South Westerly continuation of Maze.
