Monday 7<sup>th</sup> April 2014

- Di, Si, Frank. - Solorganzo.

A ramble through rural lanes in Solorganzo brought us to a halt in a farmyard with its owner. His friend Roberto arrived and Di discussed caves and their whereabouts.

He took us to a cave he knew - Cueva del Regato it turned out to be. We rigged a rope to some crash barriers dumped with other rubbish at the cleft entrance. We had a look into the entrance series and exited.

We returned to other side of the valley and parked on a lane above the previous farmyard. A traverse of the hillside into a field brought a number of possibilities - a number of entrances in an outcrop running across the field. The first one was a tight squeeze into a slot - 2765 - 3m long - choked with mud. The next one was on the same level over the fence in the brambles

2947 30T 452158 - 4801859.<sup>120</sup> Another dig at the base of

the outcrop opened into a 3.5m slot to a mud choke.

Another dig 2763 was made on a higher bench in another outcrop - a 2m slot to a mud choke.

A further dig on this level - 2762 - was a 2m hole - more a badger den than a cave! Back on the lower level, a hole was opened but densely choked with mud. - 2764.

The drive over the pass out of Solorganzo to Matienzo a series of holes at a switch back drew out attention - all three holes were filled with rubbish and rubble though a narrow slot was dug open and revealed a 4.7m hole - choked with mud -

It's a difficult dig because you're laid flat and rock stops the squeeze through but you can see the passage continuing and the thought of dropping into vaca is encouraging.


Whilst the digging was taking place Si and I wandered over to check out 3925 - it really is a rabbit hole - with no way on.

Si and Frank visited 3594 Luna de Miel to check the condition - No draught - everything was as it was left - the boulder that was causing concern has a

10/4/2014 Juan and Penny quick trip out to recce Riolastras. First to long depression that flanks the S side of the main Riolastras depression. Drive to near the end of the road where the *vecino* siesta-ing outside his house/barn was just about understandable to Penny through his 5 teeth. He knew of a group of Santander cavers who had explored a cave to the north (out of area) but said that there were no holes or draughts that he knew of along the line of the depression. Needs a proper look with an oversuit as there are many overgrown depressions on the drive in as well as shakeholes (and possible sinks) seen in the depression.

A short walk from here to a depression at approx ETRS89: 30T 0454287 4803638. No sign of holes or draught.

Drove back to the Badames road and down towards Solórzano, turning right into the hills at Bar Picón to follow the road then track that leads to *Los Pozos*. Although we could have driven to the end, we parked at the base of a steeper, rough section and walked to the end.

**Site 3949** at ETRS89: 30T 453063 4803306 Alt 147m. A depression at the edge of a sloping field with a limestone face. A small hole has no draught but the soil will dig. Length 1m. Photos. (Plotted on map)

**Site 3950** at ETRS89: 30T 453181 4803299 Alt 165m. Slightly further up the track, depression just off the track on the right has steep sides to a small(?) vertical drop which needs checking out. The eucalyptus wood has been recently felled around here. (Plotted on map).

A very quick look at the field at the end of the *Los Pozos* track found nothing, but there are a number of deep depressions to look at that require some hacking into. By heading north for 100m along a logging track then a short distance up the hill a large depression is found in a recently felled area:

**Site 3951** at ETRS89: 30T 453615, 4803686. Alt at base = 190m? GPS taken about 10m away from hole at base. Some protection is needed to explore a number of holes seen near the base. Video and photos. (Plotted on map).

Threatening thunder cut short the recce.





## **2381 shaft**

Best described as a cave. Bolted wall to give 7m ladder climb past vertical jammed boulders to walk down into large chamber. Local farmers have been here to collect water as old pipes and channels in evidence.

North across chamber leads to high aven with small high level inlet and possible passage at top. To the East below ladder and behind large boulder was an inward draughting drop into area of passage and chambers terminated by boulders and run ins need to go back with joss sticks. Another aven is present in East wall of entrance chamber. Moving anticlockwise from North passage a small inlet passage enters which splits in 2 both ways continue small and unexplored. To the West now at right angles to the major joint in the entrance chamber a low section opens up into a walking continuation, large and with boulders and a few formations to a point where roof collapse may bar the way on at this level. However an obvious way down under this collapse opens immediately onto an undescended pitch. Report on this later today (12<sup>th</sup>).



Driving back down the lane we stopped to search a tree & bramble sink hole near water trough. Simon 143↑ managed to get into the base of sink hole but only Los Pozos Area. found tyres and dead goat 3962  
 30T 451124; 4803003 ↑<sup>119↑</sup>

→ ~~Los Pozos Sinkhole~~ 30T 453633 4803499 ↑<sup>188↑</sup> 3960

We drove and parked at the end of the track in the Los Pozos area. Investigating the field to the right of the track we climbed to the highest point and found a deep sink hole - steep sides 3960 Simon descended using crowbar and Bill's magic tool as belay point. 5m down the slope a short ladder pitch of approx 5m. At the bottom covered with cow bones. No way on.

Unknown known cave. The farmer led us to a phreatic tube - in the woods. 3961 ↑<sup>arrived</sup>  
 30T 4530 87 4803385 ↑<sup>141↑</sup>

It was evident that this is a known cave as it was well trodden and covered in graffiti. As it turns out, Pete + Juan had surveyed it the year before.

13/4/14 3916 Calf Hole (Vaca Back End) Juan, Terry + P.P.

12:40 start - Rom Matienzo + team put-in 5 hrs of digging. Took "foam" to try to stabilize top edge + drill to pin in "Aero" + tubes. Dug down to rift above drop to chamber dug in 2013. All seems packed up! We have now reached the point where the rift walls open out. Way down at about 70-80 deg. Well need at least one more day to reach point where we should be able to dig horizontally to reach Vaca. Nest-tops need some "conks" + scaffolding to keep roof & back boulders safe.

13/4/14 Known, Known Cave, Cueva Nicancor 3961 Hards both Si + Di, Frankie Pearson, Bill



A large block of this sandstone has slipped towards the adjacent depression leaving a slip rift feature. This is open to the surface at one point in the side of the track where you can see a short distance down and along the rift in both directions. This is all in sandstone. Photos Phil P

3969 BOT 0444642 4800145 ETRS89. Cave. Seen from the road on the opposite hillside this feature appeared to be an open entrance. When located it was an overhanging wet and dark sandstone outcrop, it's in the middle of the gully and just below a forestry track. There was a good draught coming out from below the outcrop, through numerous rocks which may have been placed in here sometime ago. A couple of hours digging allowed Phil P to get in about 3m more work required. Photos Phil P.

Scouting round at this location didn't reveal any more sites.

Site 2381 back to drop second pitch which drops into a chamber with a further drop for which we had no gear. Returning tomorrow. Had a look at some other leads which need digging to progress. Carried out simple line survey.

Continued digging towards small black hole soon led to view into chamber. With the aid of a hammer the thinnest was able to get thro' and engineer a larger hole for the rest.

The cuboidal chamber is roughly 10 by 6 metres and about 5 m high.

The sides are mainly made of enormous blocks with gaps. There are ways-on everywhere - behind the blocks below them and above them, in fact a giant boulder choke. Despite much effort no obvious way on was found but unusually for this cave there was no draught.

A simple line survey was done from surface to main chamber.

Sunday 13th

Cave 626 - undescended shaft

GC's report follows:-

" Descended to bottom of shaft. Shaft is split in two, the top part is ~8m landing on a sloping muddy ledge. Below this ledge is another ~8m pitch landing at the bottom. The base if the shaft is 10m x 4m with no visible way on. The floor is covered in mud, cobbles, rubbish and bones. The walls of the bottom part of the shaft are solid, with the top part loose. On my way out I noticed on one side a narrow rift heading off, about 5 to 6m above the base. As I was trying to work out a way to get to it, I noticed on the opposite side of the shaft an opening I could get too. I swung across to this opening, I unclipped from the rope and headed into a passage about 1m by 1m. After 4m the passage opens into a small chamber 2.5 to 3m high and the same wide. When inspecting the floor I could see through the mud and loose fill. I rolled down some stones, and could hear them rattling down a fare way. I expect this is a parallel shaft to the main one, only filled with large blocks and cobbles. This could be dug, although stacking space would be tricky. An exit was the made to the surface."

A trip down to I Went It All. The water levels were much lower than 2 summers ago, and the streamway almost pleasant. We surveyed some loops off the main passage, starting at the 'open' lead off just before I Went It All - 3 oxbows back to the main passage. The initial survey point is 1.27 from the original survey. Tim and Brendan got through the squeeze in I Went It All and had a poke around. There is a very strong draught through the squeeze, much stronger than that coming from the entrance to May of the Problamatique. We climbed up the boulder pile above the squeeze, and got into the side passages surveyed on the original survey. The final leg with no passage dated leads to a complete choke. There is

WPS footage back out from this to just before the undescended pitch. Unfortunately, the footage of the lower area of this was taken through a lens so dirty it obscures any useful images. The undescended pitch is ~ 10m in a rift and not obviously draughting but not explored too closely - it is hard to say if there is passage below. There are possibilities of a few high lead leads, but they may just be blind alleys - without gaining entry it is not possible to see.

Heading back out we got a number of photos - notably the passage above Boulevard of Broken Dreams, ~~as~~ the area off Long Road to Ruin (a bolting project, will a slight continuation ~ 15m up followed by a letting out - photos and video) and some crystal pools between Eye of the Tiger and Bridge over Troubled Waters.

We also surveyed a short series of passages opposite the entrance to the passage to Tin Man Junction - previously entered but including a nice grotto which didn't appear to have been visited before (video taken).

Finally, Tim and Brendon did some digging in a side passage just after the pitch into this way and that (the offset stream passage on the survey). This sandy crawl breaks into a larger continuation but access is prevented by boulders. A wrecking bar would probably allow entry, but the air seems quite stale. Not surveyed.

Crawling along a road through the Recueva area, a local asked us what we were looking for. He enlisted the help of a *vecino* and, after parking up at a dead-end junction, they both led us down a slippery track, through jungle, to the draughting, gated cave entrance. This is on a steep gully side, above a small resurgence.

We returned up a short climb to the right of the entrance and a straight line walk back up through a field to the car. The return route is the more straightforward way to the cave.



15/5/2014 Pete and Juan to **Torca Cañasos** (site 4013) at Villaverde de Pontones. Approach is through the Lupa carpark at Hoznayo, under the motorway and up the hill. This hole (at approximately ETRS89:0443546 4805707) is just out of the permit area but it connects into the **Riocueva** (4012) system which is on our permit. As it has an archaeological dig near the bottom entrance, Juan Colina (FCE President) suggested we should use this entrance rather than try to get a key for the gated lower entrance.

Parking 100m to the northeast of the entrance depression, we walked down the road then skirted the vegetation until it was possible to walk down through the trees to the large pitch.

Three ladders and a double line were tied back with rope to the largest tree and the ladders hung down a notch just to the right of where a small trickle falls down the drop. The pitch, advertised as 18m, turned out to be 15m vertical. (The entrance altitude is given as 61m but this needs checking with a surface survey back to a spot height on the Cantabria map). It should be possible to rig the drop for SRT but it might be a bit technical with a traverse line required to reach decent limestone.

The intention for the afternoon was to pick a passage and survey it. At the drippy pitch base (with rubbish and bones) there are probably at least 3 passages going off. (Station 80 is marked under a short climb up into one). We walked down the slope, past a possible drop on the right to the underground river (with a tyre) and walked off into the *Galería del Yeso*. Fifty minutes of mainly walking (quite slowly) we reached an "end" where a small crawl through over pointy objects was too awkward to push too hard. A lump hammer and chisel will sort this out – or a small person. It turned out that this point is probably as far as the Spanish cavers surveyed anyway. There seemed to be no draught. The day was sunny but not particularly warm.

Surveying back to the entrance took about 3½ hours (82 stations, 767m passage length). Some paper survey stations were left at possible junctions but no side passages were looked at.

Some video was taken on the GoPro Hero3 but more light than just head torches is required for better results. The passage is well worth a return to check out the end and the question marks (one of which should be the *Galería Mabe* and the *Paso del Diablo* where accidents and rescues have taken place, see Cantabria Subterránea – rope required?) Photography in the Yeso gallery will also be worthwhile, with chunky formations, columns, grottos and high false floors with old stream cobbles underneath.

Did a couple more dives in Comellantes at Easter, bit didn't get as far as the Squirrel's connection, mainly because i'd not dived for ages and was using too much air, before the rain caused the vis to drop. However, im still convinced the main tunnel has been missed somewhere there, so im hoping to come back for a week in the summer and have a good look around.

One thing is that the entrance now existing for Embalse (and this time we couldn't enter because of a pile of dead animals) is not the same as the original one, as I think is explained in the 2007 Easter logbook. So it might have been a little nearer to Corte in the past.

It's said to contain the biggest chamber in the cave, Sala de los Volcanes, and ends at another entrance. In the account it says it reaches the bottom of a sima. I saw Pepe León yesterday and he said they found it from inside the cave, and he remembers it as a walk-in entrance. But they had to go back through the cave to get their equipment and never located the entrance on the surface!
